#### **FORWARD**

The 1994-95 Annual Report is a significant achievement for the Auburn District Cricket Club. For the first occasion since 1951 this report is fully computerised with all statistical club and player data automatically updated at the push of a button.

All the report's pages and supporting data files are imbedded within a powerfull PC spreadsheet and word processor, comprising 5 major files and totalling almost 6 megabytes of information. In fact there are over 26,200 complex logical and mathematical formulae which find players' stats, calculate all totals and averages and update each player's career records, again at the push of a button. If you sneeze your stats may be updated, so be careful.

The files contain the records of every player who donned the Auburn cap since the club's inception in 1951. The project has taken over 8 months to complete and involved retrieving countless records from old scorebooks, and past annual reports. For safety, the files are currently resident on two independant 486dx2/66 meg systems as well as incorporating the normal back-up techniques, and are completely portable.

From this moment on the upkeep of club statistics and the production of our annual report is no longer a major drama, requiring countless hours of manual hard "yakka". Sincere thanks go to Steven Blomfield who spent much of those countless hours providing many of the statistics contained in the files.

Your committee proudly presents this 44TH ANNUAL REPORT for your perusal. Read on and enjoy, but sneeze with caution.

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

My first year as President has been to say the least an eye opening experience and combined with our poor performances on the field, not very rewarding. The problems facing the Club's future need to be addressed now, before season 95-96 begins. Our incoming management committee needs to be active immediately. Three areas of concern to me are:

Firstly the management committee has to be much more active and work as a team not leaving things to the usual few. The committee for 95-96 will be elected at the annual general meeting and you should all think seriously about who you vote for because without the necessary commitment from the elected people the club again will flounder.

Second area for concern has been the general lack of commitment from players highlighted by the fact we required one hundred and one players (a club record) to field four sides. Of the one hundred and one only seven players were available for all games. Once again we were plagued by last minute "pull outs" which appears to be a part of playing cricket for Auburn. These last minute unavailabilities not only disrupt team stability but also cause selectors and Team Captains undue work and stress.

Third problem has been the loss of experienced players. Over the last five or so years we have been depleted of senior players. These seniors are needed in the club to foster and encourage our up and coming junior talent and provide the benefit of their experience.

So much for our problems. On the positive side there are encouraging signs. Our canteen has operated successfully and thanks must go to G. Kenny and Staff for their effort. A job well done. New comers to the club Paul and Julie Bucholtz deserve thanks for assisting in the canteen. There were also others who helped out. Thanks to all those people. The facilities at Mona Park are of a high standard and are a credit to Auburn Council. Special thanks for their support and efforts in providing us with good playing conditions. Testimony to their efforts are evident in our hosting an under 19's representative game and the Shires Second Grade Final.

The club does have a number of junior players showing necessary talent and commitment to succeed. Because of lack of numbers at the beginning of the season some of these players had to be selected in higher grades than would be normal. These players performed well and need to be retained by the club.

We experienced an increase in numbers of parents attending games on a regular basis. To me this is a very pleasing aspect and should be encouraged. I urge any of the parents wishing to be involved with the club to make themselves available as all help is welcome.

In concluding I want to offer thanks to Ted Suchy and Steve Blomfield for their effort in computerising our club statistics and producing this report. My personal thanks to Mike Wood and Dave Tribolet in helping make a difficult job for me a lot easier.

Whilst Greg and Robbie will be pursuing their grade careers next season, we have appreciated their input and wish them both every success in their future endeavours.

One positive to emerge from this season was the club spirit generated by the after match socialising in the Dave Tribolet Room at Mona Park. The generous after game donations to club finances by Dan Burton, Matt Bensemann and the Mitchell brothers in particular, were greatly appreciated by the Treasurer. Special mention must be made of the dedication and long hours put in by Ted Suchy in computerising the entire playing records of the Club since its inception in 1951. Ted has also computerised the annual report and updated each round of team and player performances throughout the season. Thanks for a great job Ted. The contribution of Steve Blomfield in assisting Ted should also not be overlooked.

The poor performances of our four sides was not a reflection on the effort put in by our club coach, Matthew Troy who worked tirelessly all season. It is just a pity that more players don't take advantage of Matt's experience and expertise to improve their playing skills.

Once again the commitment level of far too many players was found to be lacking this season. Until these players learn to be sincere in their commitment to playing every game and also to putting in the effort at practice, their true potential will never be realised.

The club continues to have a very good rapport with the Auburn Council and it is hoped this will continue for many years to come. The assistance and support from the General Manager, Mr. George Toemoe, The Mayor, Councillor, and the Parks and Gardens Supervisor, Anthony Donalson, as well as the groundstaff, Graham, Alan and Mark has greatly been appreciated.

The Auburn Council's efforts to improve the facilities at Mona Park were rewarded when the ground was allocated the Western Australia v's ACT match in the Australian U/19 Championships which was held in January. During this match the club played host to Council dignitaries and other special guests at a luncheon in the Dave Tribolet Room on the first day's play, which provided the club with the opportunity to thank Council Executives and Councillors for their commitment to cricket in the district.

The on-going support and encouragement of Councillor Helen Lane, who is also a Club Patron, must also be mentioned because without such support the club would not be enjoying the facilities we have today.

Due to the expertise of Gerry Kenny and the assistance given by Allison and Andrew Kenny, the Mona Park Canteen recorded a record profit for the first time in a number of years. A magnificent effort from the Kenny Clan.

A new innovation this year was the formation by the NSWCA of the Cumberland Cricket Council, which was formed to foster the development of cricket at both junior and senior levels within the council boundaries of Auburn, Parramatta, Holroyd and Baulkham Hills. The Cricket Council also incorporates the Parramatta Grade Club, Auburn, Baulkham Hills and Holroyd Shire clubs, as well as representatives from the Parramatta Junior Association, and the Dept. of Sport and Recreation.

The Cricket Council will meet every two months and will be undertaking a number of initiatives, such as coaching clinics, throughout the Summer and Winter months. NSW Shield representative Trevor Bayliss is the Secretary/Co-ordinator of the Cricket Council.

Congratulations to Canterbury (First Grade), Lindfield (Second Grade), Macquarie Uni (Third Grade) and Strathfield (Fourth Grade) on taking out their respective competitions. Let's hope that the 1995-96 season sees the club become more competitive, with a greater level of commitment from the players.

Finally, a special thanks to Bob Hadley, Roselyn and Dave Tribolet for their help and assistance throughout the season.

#### FIRST GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

During the 1994-95 season twenty-five players gained selection in the first grade side. The final results of the fifteen matches were:

- 3 First Innings Wins
- \* 1 Tie
- \* 2 Draws
- \* 7 First Innings Losses
- \* 2 Outright Losses

This placed the side on 21 points and in 13th place on the final points table. However, all who played in or followed the progress of the side know that there were at least 5 games where the side held the commanding position and either bad weather failed to allow completion or we faltered at vital stages and the games slipped away from our grasp.

In the early stages of the season the side was made up of a few older "seasoned" campaigners and many young and inexperienced players at first grade level. Our first game against Bexley was almost a "fairy tale" beginning, and on the first day we bowled solidly to restrict Bexley to 6 / 277 on a very good batting Mona wicket. On the second day we began strongly and had the game well and truly under control at 0/170. Sadly, we slumped, due to youthfulness, to be all out for 252 just 26 runs short of the winning target.

A few disappointing performances followed in the next couple of games and it wasn't until the Lindfield game that we got back to playing to a standard that our enthusiasm suggested we were capable of.

In some ways luck wasn't going our way - vital tosses were lost, bowlers were beating the bat consistently without gaining wickets and batsmen were getting out just as they appeared to be on the verge of compiling a big score.

Our first win came in round 6 against Pennant Hills. We started strongly, bowling them out for just 92. We passed their total easily and sent them in again but were unable to bowl them out twice in a one day game. The next two games against Canterbury and South East Sydney were disappointing losses for the side, but the new year seemed to herald the dawning of a new era for the team. From the early days of January to the end of the season we began playing very consistently and competitively.

Around this time we gained the services of two Sydney first grade players, Greg Small and then Robbie Aitken. These two players brought a wealth of experience and skill to the side that helped lift everyone's performances. In the games that followed we had a tie against Burwood, followed by a points winning wash-out draw against Epping. A courageous and hard fought victory over Roseville, and probably the game of the season against Macquarie Uni where we lost on the first innings by just one run and later almost secured an outright win ... these were Auburn highlights. Our second last game against Warringah was once again washed out when we were in a commanding position and finally we finished the season in round 15 with a comprehensive first innings victory over Blacktown.

On reflection of the season there are a few points to draw attention to:

- \* The first grade side failed to win a match at Mona Park during the season. The Mona wicket is definitely a "result" wicket and we need to develop both the right attitude and techniques towards mastering it.
- \* If the first grade side are to be a force in the competition we need to gain the services of one or two experienced quality players to help support our very young and inexperienced players.
- \* We have blooded a number of young players in first grade this year and we must look at both encouraging and assisting them in their future years with the Auburn club.
- \* We must endeavour as a club to enhance the training facilities at Mona and encourage attendance of players so we can develop individual skills and build club playing standards.
- \* We need to build positive harmony and a social atmosphere within teams, and as a club, by both organised activities and attendance after games in the Dave Tribolet room.

Many thanks to the loyal parents and supporters who attended first grade matches. To Gerry, Alison, and Andrew Kenny we have all greatly appreciated and benefitted from the canteen and the service they provided and of course the way they prepared and served the best afternoon teas in Shire cricket. Thanks also to Ross Abercrombie for often doing the arduous cricket scoring duties of the first grade side.

Josh is extremely competitive and always provides a lift to the team with his energy and determination. On two occasions during the season once when he was knocked unconscious in the field and secondly when he lost his two front teeth wicketkeeping, Josh returned to the game to resume the field after seeking medical treatment and advice which he duly ignored. Such is his commitment to the team. Josh can bat, bowl and wicket keep, while his wicketkeeping is a bonus when required with the experience of this season on turf under his belt Josh will come back next season a much better cricketer and valuable all rounder.

#### Sam Bucholtz

Sam has a great deal of potential as batsmen and the 52 no he scored against Canterbury under high pressure demonstrated his talent. While the majority of Sam's scores in 94/95 were in the teens or twenties I have absolutely no doubt that given continued practice and the maturity that comes with age and experience Sam has a very bright cricketing future.

#### Brett Grenfell

Brett only played third grade by choice because of his study commitments. Brett is a brilliant aggressive batsmen who scored 3 half centuries on the trot and a very sharp left hand opening bowler. If anything Brett's bowling was too good as he beat the bat so easily that the batsmen were not good enough to get an edge. While Brett may not score runs so freely in 1st grade I'm sure he would have more luck with the ball. (ironic isn't it). Brett's cricket ability provided a natural lift to the team whenever he played and was sorely missed in the last few games when he was unavailable. I only wish I could think of a way to keep him in third grade next season when his study commitments are over.

## Mike Wood

Mike has played 1st grade and shires cricket, and the experience and knowledge he brought to third grade was invaluable. While he may have passed his prime as a batsmen, as a bowler he is as crafty and skilful as ever. His ability to turn a game is always present, such as his 5 wicket haul against Roseville and 7/29 against Blacktown. Mike's close in fielding is still sharp and his high standards and expectations of fielding are beneficial to the team even though the recipients of a Woody serve may not appreciate it at the time. It is essential the experience of players such as Mike is passed on to up and coming players and not lost all together. I applaud Mike for choosing to play in Thirds and share with us his cricketing expertise, not to mention his bowling skills.

### Craig Clunis

Craig is one of the best young keepers I have seen. His anticipation of the ball direction and agility ensures very little escapes his gloves and he did not allow any catching opportunities to escape his grasp. While he is only relatively young, Craig slotted into the team as if he had played for seasons. As a bowler I was always confident if a catching opportunity presented itself. Craig would swallow it. I hope Craig returns next season to Auburn as good keepers are hard to find and Craig is excellent.

### Wes Saunders

Wes has still not developed the consistency in his batting that will make a great batsmen, but when Wes is on fire he is a great batsmen to watch, will score plenty of runs and won't take too long to do it. What is so interesting he usually produces his best form when under extreme pressure. As a bowler Wes showed greatly improved pace and direction this season and would have captured a lot more wickets if catches had stuck. It seemed whenever one went down either Wes or Mike Wood were bowling.

I believe Wes is a very talented cricketer, the best of which we have not yet even remotely seen.
