Unlike last Season, the batting was much more consistent, with six players scoring more than 250 runs each and several others improving considerably on the previous Season.

The brunt of the bowling rested on the shoulders of Bill Balfour (62 wickets), George Parry (55 wickets), and John Aitken (50 wickets), and each turned on some very good performances. To have three bowlers each take over 50 wickets was an excellent performance.

The wicket-keeping, after the first couple of matches, was carried out by the energetic Hilton Harrison who showed improvement every match and should be a first class "Aunt Sally" next Season.

Fielding at most times was very good and the catching really first rate. It was in this very important department that a number of matches were won. Some of the players to shine were Bill Balfour (21 catches), Alan Ingleby (17 catches), George Parry, Athol Mines and Les Howard. The most improved fieldsman in the team was undoubtedly Ron Knott whose keenness was worth watching.

Once again the wicket at Mona Park was in bad condition, and the wicket on which the Final was played, an absolute disgrace. The continued deterioration of the wicket at Mona Park, to my mind, has become a serious problem.
