DAVE STANFORD - Dave had a great season, one every cricketer would love, Dave scored his runs in all sorts of situations, that, to look at his average and aggregate does not really tell the whole story of how he set about amassing his runs, his 115 against the premiers Lindfield really was to me a most memorable century. His fielding was of high standard whilst patrolling in the covers. Congratulations Dave.

BOB JANCZUK - Bob had one very important innings against Wentworthville where he set the basis for our winning score, but unfortunately for the rest of the season he could not repeat the performance. Bob has fallen into a bad habit which he will have to work on, but Bob has that sort of persistance that I am sure he will iron out the problem and again make his presence felt to the opposition, fielding was of a high standard, except he will have to work on his returns.

RAY GENTLES - This year I asked Ray to take the job of No.3 a very important position and Ray being the great team man he is did not hesitate although his experience in this position in "A" grade was extremely limited. This year Ray had more confidence in himself, he reached double figures eight times and figured in quite a number of large partnerships. I am sure that after this year's experience as first drop he will blossom next year and turn starts into scores. Ray also fielded quite well with an excellent performance against Burwood.

His fielding was good but at times did lose concentration in the slip area.

GRANT SAUNDERS - This was Grant's first season with the Club and what a great acquisition to the team this all-rounder is. His bowling was very impressive, his batting was something to break the back of any bowling attack. His final bowling effort against Semi-Finalists Pennant Hills 11 overs, 3 for 27 was one of many fine bowling performances of the season. He also scored a fine 5β against Premiers Lindfield and took some fine catches throughout the season. An important member for our bid for the Premiership next season.

BRIAN (CHICA) MOORE - Brian has probably never bowled so few overs as he did last season but whenever he was called on to bowl he always seemed to figure in breaking up the partnership that was becoming dangerous, any other player would have grumbled about his lack of bowling but Brian has the sense to realise that if the other bowlers are doing it then that is that. His batting this year was nothing short of courageous and a lesson to some of our more recognized batsmen, Brian's fielding was extremely enthusiastic but then you would not expect anything less from a truly great team and club man.

LINDSAY REES - Lindsay started the season off like crackerjack with a splendid 92 then broke his hand in the same game which meant a whole new start. Lindsay ran third in the aggregate but had a very up and down season, his batting did show a lot more maturity than previous years and was probably the outstanding fieldsman for the year taking some fantastic catches.

STEVE FINCH - Steve made it into "A" grade after some fine performances in the "B's" but unfortunately he never scored the runs in "A" grade which he might. Although he had the ability to hang around he seemed to get bogged down on occasions. I think Steve was pretty nervous at times but next season he should show us that he is capable of scoring freely also in "A" grade. Fielding was very good with safe hands.

IAN JOHNSON - Ian Johnson proved to everyone that this fellow is one of the most talented and gutsy cricketers in the competition - over 300 runs and 36 wickets. I believe Ian will go even better next year because all he does is improve. Ian is a Captain's delight as there is nothing that he will not do for his team. His batting and bowling this year was truly superb and he deservedly won the Player of the Year Trophy.

ROCH FINDLAY - Roch joined the "A" grade after 5 games in the "B" grade, he quickly cemented his place in the "A" grade with a match winning bowling effort against Epping 21 overs 5 for 47, but Roch's batting was the most eye-catching after being thrown into the opening spot against Canterbury he scored a fine 75 not out after we were at one stage 3 for 9. He showed maturity in this and other situations beyond his eighteen years.

BERNIE CLIFTON - Bernie played the first five games with us and showed why he had always troubled Auburn batsmen before he joined the Club. Unfortunately for Bernie we could not afford to carry three left-arm spinners. Bernie's bowling whilst in "A" grade was of a very high standard, his batting also quite impressive considering he was batting No.10.

RON JOHNSON - Owing to ill-health Ron was unable to play a full season of cricket and his season was one of stops and starts. Ron played four games for the "A" grade and fitted in as though he had played all the season.

WAL SHEPHERD - Wal only played three games early in the season until he became unavailable but, in those three games he proved that he is the one person who can be called upon to perform in any grade and do exactly that. Top scoring in our dismal performance against Lane Cove, his fielding as always excellent.

I suppose it could be said we were unlucky to have just missed out on the semis due to the bad luck we experienced early in the season with the weather, where analysing the matches concerned we missed out on approximately 16 points - however reviewing the complete season a number of other factors had a lot to do with our non-success.
