I would like to congratulate the Epping A grade team for achieving what for us is a frustrated ambition.



#### THE "A" GRADE PLAYERS

Ted Suchy: (Vice Capt.) A giant amongst us in batsmanship. Ted has been fighting hard the last few seasons to regain the form which saw him set the club record for batting aggregate of 638 runs in 1967-68. It was a great pleasure not only for Ted himself but for every player in the A grade to see him regain that form. Ted's approach to his batting is an example to us all, he punished the bad ball while respecting the good one. Brilliant innings of 92 v's Bexley and 79 v's Macquarie highlighted a wonderful season. Fielding was again of a high standard, always enthusiastic and fast establishing a reputation as a 'run out' specialist. Ted, your support shown me as Vice Captain was very much appreciated. Congratulations on a fine season.

Felix Molski: The 'Supercricketer' of Auburn. One does not see very often a player get as much enjoyment from the game as Felix. A tremendous amount of effort goes into not only his bowling but fielding as well. By taking 35 wickets in A grade this season Felix has 'come of age' with his bowling and now commands the respect of every batsman in A grade. His fielding, catching and returns to the wicket merited commendation through-out the season. He emerged as a batsman of some potential with a match-winning innings of 24 against Canterbury.

Ron Johnson: Ron's 231 runs and 31 wickets were a valuable contribution to the success of the team. Not as successful as Ron would have hoped however his enthusiastic approach and fighting qualities are always a welcome sight when the team strikes trouble. His fielding this season was the best we have seen from Ron and he took some fine catches.

<u>Ian Johnson</u>: Not a good season for Ian. Luck did not go his way and although Ian didn't bowl as well as he is capable of many catches were missed. His batting shows much potential but lacks application. Fielding was up to his usually high standard.

John Berry: John emerged as a real threat to slow-footed batsmen with his 'off-spinners'. He achieved great control of length and direction. As with all good spinners, the longer he bowls the wilier he becomes. John should go from strength to strength. Fielded well throughout the season and always gave me his full support. Much appreciated John.

Ray Gentles: Ray must have been happy with his batting overall last season, scoring 230 runs at 28.75. His form in A grade was a little disappointing and I feel that if Ray is to improve he will have to show more aggression at the crease. His fielding was not as consistant as expected however took some fine catches.

<u>Dave Viegel</u>: Dave must realise that if he is to hold his position in A grade he will have to be a little more dedicated. Has the potential to open the batting but lacks practice. Some excellent fielding during the season.

Dave Noyes: Started the season in brilliant fashion but when his form fell away so did his interest. Will have to dedicate himself more to the game and the club next year to succeed.

Lyle Fry: Lyle returned to the club after a few seasons absence. Although he did not have a successful season in A grade Lyle has an enormous amount of class and next season will see him bag a whole lot of runs.

Arthur Rudgley: Arthur did not have one of his most successful seasons. His bag of 26 wickets was nevertheless a valuable contribution. Fielding was of a high standard. It was a great thrill to see Arthur obtain his 500th wicket and he now joins our President George Parry as the only players in the history of the club to achieve this feat. Congratulations Arthur, you must be very proud to have achieved this.

Always showed keeness in the field and one of the top fieldsmen in the side, held a great catch at short cover off a blazing cover drive against Pennant Hills early on in the season.

Lindsay Rees: Lindsay had a good season with the bat averaging 25.5 in B grade. A dashing type of opening batsman who is likely to get the better of any attack and made a number of aggressive starts. His fielding was generally of a high standard. Called upon to bowl offspinners at various times throughout the season, Lindsay did reasonably well, his best figures being 4/62 against Lane Cove. A good team player.

It would do more seasoned players a lot of good to take note of his concentration at the crease. His long innings had a major part in keeping the B's hopes alive for the semi finals. Fielding was always very good.

Ken Collins: Ken only had a few games in the B's scoring a good 73 against Lindfield. A solid hard hitting type of batsman who has the ability to get much higher aggregate than he did this year and a more rewarding season is hoped for in 1974-75. His fielding was of a very high standard in the B's and always showed keeness to chase the ball. A good team player.

Steve Gerrard: Steve too only had a few games in the B's, his best score being 52 against Lindfield. Fielding always reliable and an asset to any side.

With more games under his belt (cricket) would undoubtedly had a more profitable season. Pat is moving to Canberra and best wishes go with him and many thanks for tremendous service to the club over a number of seasons. His fielding was first class and it was very satisfying having a player of his experience in the side.
