

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Season number 43 was I feel a rebuilding year and subsequently our performances were not premiership winning, but certainly competitive in all grades and gives us much confidence for the future.

Congratulations to all trophy winners. It is particularly pleasing to see 8 of the top 10 in the player of the year points are under 21 and well done to Glen Mitchell (P.O.Y. Winner). And Michael Purdon (fielding) for the great efforts. Two very talented young players. In fact we have some young players with tremendous potential and through their commitment and with the coach's help there is no reason they can't go a long way.

Our relationship with Auburn Council stays on excellent terms. We are extremely fortunate to have this support and the opening of the new extensions at Mona Park was, to me, the highlight of the season. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Mayor, Stan Hedges, Councillor, Helen Lane, General Manager, George Tomoe and our good friend Andy Donaldson. Others, who made this day so successful were, John Pedro Alvarez and NSW Coach Steve 'Stumpa' Rixon, for organising the players for the celebrity match. Also the ringleaders of our committee, Michael Wood, Bob Hadley, Darren O'Brien and Vinnie Connor, plus all those others involved, my sincere thanks for a day I will never forget.

The new facilities are magnificent and just about gives us the perfect set up. We are working on obtaining those few extra facilities that will give us the best dual cricket complex in Sydney. As we go to print, it is nearly confirmed that a match in the under 19 National Championships will be played at Mona No. 1 in early January 95.

The financial side of the club needs to improve. The club is providing a good level of cricket on good turf wickets and the costs involved in this is continually rising, unless we can pick up one or two major sponsors, members fees will have to increase. If any member can put us on to a sponsor, please let us know.

Finally my thanks to all club members for their efforts this year, we all know we can improve on this years efforts, so lets approach 1994 - 95 with confidence and commitment on and off this field.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Once again a season that started well and promised so much, delivered so little. At one stage the Club was travelling extremely good, with "A" Grade on the fringe of the top four, "B" "C" and "D" Grades all entrenched in the top four and the club leading the Club Championship.

Then the wheels fell off, with the end result being that none of our four grades made the semi-finals. I have no doubt that the decline in the performance of the lower grades in the second half of the season was related to fall-off in attendance at club practice. When attendance goes from an average of 25-30 to 10-15 something has to be wrong with the attitude and commitment of players.

It is disappointing to see the club employ a coach of the quality of Matthew Troy, only to see the players, in particular the younger players, not take advantage of it to improve their skills or overcome problems they maybe having with their game. The lack of effort at practice is clearly showing in the individual performance level of players when you consider that no "B", "C" or "D" Grade player, Tony ross excepted, scored over 250 runs for the season. Only six bowlers took more than 20 wickets, with the highest aggregate being Glenn Mitchell and Brad Stones 27 wickets each.

Glenn established himself as an "A" Grade player and proved to be a whole hearted style of bowler who always managed to make a breakthrough early in the innings, while Brad continues to improve each season. There are a lot of talented young cricketers in this Club and one can only hope that they work hard in order to realise their talent.

The Club's English guest, Phil Blackmore settled in well and proved to be a popular figure within the Club. Whilst Phil didn't set the world on fire with the bat, there is no doubt that he has talent and with the experience gained from his stay with us will no doubt develop into a very competent cricketer. Phil was the perfect guest and was always willing to give a hand. Best of luck for the future Phil and we hope to see you back here one day.

With the completion of the new amenities room at Mona Park, facilities at the ground are second to none. The foresight of the Auburn Council in undertaking the extensions and renovations is to be commended. It is very pleasing to see the Councils continued commitment to fostering this great game of cricket and the continued support of people such as George Toemoe, (General Manager), Stan Hedges, (Mayor), Helen Lane, (Councillor), Andy Donaldson, (Parks and Gardens Supervisor), as well as Mark and Graham (Ground Staff) is very much appreciated by all members of the Club.

Further, to Allison and Andrew Kenny thanks for an excellent job in running the Canteen throughout the season.

Whilst this season did not reach the heights that we would have hoped, there is no doubt that there is enough talent in this Club to make next season a very successful one and I have every confidence that it will be.

"A" GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The 1993 - 94 season well not go down as one of the most outstanding for Auburn's "A" grade side. It started with high expectations but with just three first innings wins, one draw and nine first innings losses it fell well short of intended outcomes. However, in the second half of the season there were signs that if players are prepared to work harder on their game, build solid team totals and bowl accurate line and length, combined with enthusiastic fielding then Auburn can move up the competition ladder in the coming season.

Over the season 23 player gained 'A' grade positions. It was rare that the same eleven players played together in two consecutive matches and this didn't help the side to stabilise and build a good understanding between players.

Our batting was the main failure of the season. Only once were we able to bat out an entire days play and often we had collapses which saw four or five wickets fall for less than 20 runs thus ruining any chance of building substantial scores. We only managed to score two scores in excess of 200 runs during the season and often left ourselves with low scores to defend. Only three players scored in excess of 250 runs and they and other team members realised that often their impatience or poor shot selection, rather than good bowling, led to their dismissals.

Our bowling also lacked the penetration required to bowl out sides. There were only four occasions where we were able to bowl the opposition side out and in three of those matches against Pennant Hills, epping and Lane Cove, we were able to score first innings wins. Glen Mitchell bowled whole heartedly throughout the season and was the leading wicket taker with Vince Connor on 22 wickets.

As the dust settles on the 1993 - 94 season and we start getting itchy feet for the new season ahead, let's reflect on those winning experiences and learn that hard work, both on and off the field, coupled with support and encouragement of each other, will bind a group of individuals into a formidable team to be reckoned with in the 1994 - 95 season.

The final round of the season came around with Auburn requiring 1st innings win to make the finals. Unfortunately I lost the toss on a better and Lindfield finished with 7/256 at end of play. At the start of the 2nd week, the Lindfield Captain then proceeded to take the "weak" option and baton for 8 overs. (Mind you, they only needed about 50 points to make the final!!) and add another 50 runs. I was really proud of the way the guys had a ping at the runs and also pleased that Lindfield did not get 1st innings points. A great double from Matty Bensemann with 5/51 and 65 n/o.

SUMMARY

Whilst it was disappointing to miss the finals, I think we are really starting to see the Club more in a positive direction. There is now a bright confidence in the Club and this was reflected in the way the "B" Grade contested every game. I am pleased to say that Auburn B Grade had a chance of winning every game it played in.

The improvement will come in 94/95 if every player - not only in B grade, but in the whole club, increases and lift's his concentration to focus on being successful. Our batsman need to show more care in shot selection and try to build innings. It is pretty rare to see a Auburn Side bat out the 85 overs at this stage. the bowling (as it always is) was outstanding in B grade this season and although the fielding improved more work is required in this area.

I would personally like to thank every player that played in B grade this season for the efforts and hoped they enjoyed their season as much as I did. Special thanks to Brett Hanshaw who ably assisted me as "vice" throughout the season and for his enthusiasm towards the team. Also special thanks to Brett Tribs and Simon Percival for their advice and experience when it was needed. Thankyou also to Brad Store for his outstanding efforts during the season and for listening to and providing opinions on his Captains various cricket theories in the car to and from games. Finally, thanks to the Committee for giving me the opportunity to Captain the Auburn B Grade team. It was an absolute pleasure.!

D' GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Well, what might have been.

The D grade season kicked off with a hard fought victory against Canterbury by a courageous although disappointing loss to Roseville by a nine man field team who performed like men possessed. That effort combined with a big hitting 118 by a jet-lagged Jason Cook saw us fall only 18 runs short of a victory (one of the many games that got away).

What happened over he next two rounds was nothing short of miraculous. Two outright victories against Warringah and Pennant Hills saw Auburn "D" grade race to a big lead on the competition table. In a low scoring game against Warringah in which the bowlers dominated Wes Saunders, Paul Skinner and Gerry Kenny showed strong performances with the bat, Wes in particular starring with a magnificat 105 in the second innings. However the highlight for me was a mesmerising bowling display by Trent Owens who took 10 wickets for the match, including a spell of 7 overs, 6 maidens, 7 wickets for 6 runs. This set the scene for a strong season by one of Auburn's rising stars.

That positive victory was followed up by a strong batting performance against Pennant Hills. Gerry Kenny and Trent Owens both scored half centuries being well supported by Joel Cronan, Louis Sohal and Lloyd Owens. The bowling honours were shared with Judd Duhigg picking up 4 wickets in the second innings.

The next match against Holroyd saw the discovery of Simon Fitzhenry, whose innings of 54 oozed skill and ability. Simon has yet to reach his full potential, however, his debut season in Shires cricket showed that he is an exciting prospect. Simon was well supported in this match by Trent Owens (52), Steve Perks (44) and Wes Feeney (39 N/O) unfortunately the momentum which the side had built up over the previous two rounds was "stumped" by the intervention of rain during the Holroyd innings.

Epping was the next side to fall victim of the early season form of Auburn although early in our first innings things looked decidedly shaky. At 6 for 114 (having lost 3 wickets for 1 run) Simon Fitzhenry (76) was fast running out of partners. However a gritty and determined innings of 54 N/O by Marc Rouillon helped steer Auburn to a good first innings total of 274. Rain again looked like denying Auburn a well deserved victory but our persistence paid off in a stop start affair which saw Epping bowled out for 99, Judd Duhigg taking the honours with the ball with 3 for 23 off 12 overs well supported by all bowlers.

It was at this point in the season that Auburn started going backwards. After a great start to the season we managed to win only one of our last seven matches. Only just failing to make the final four we were to rue many missed opportunities. However I believe our decline was due mainly to the decline in people turning up for training together with our inability to bat out an entire days play all season!!! The sooner players realise that shires is not park cricket but a useful stepping stone to grade cricket (for which all young players should be striving) and a serious competition in tis own right, the sooner Auburn will begin winning the comp.

Finally I'd like to thank all those players who played in "D" Grade during the season for their effort and support and I hope to see all the same faces next season.


