In submitting this report I do so with a great amount of satisfaction, in as much that the team, in its third season

finished by taking out the Premiership honours.

Outstanding features of our victory were good fielding, improved catching, (especially in slips), excellent wicket-keeping, improved batting of the middle batsmen and accurate sustained bowling by three bowlers.

Our batting was very consistent, with four batsmen, namely, D. Perkins, G. Parry, M. Parry and D. Corbett, scoring over 300 runs while R. Brown and W. Balfour also scored over 280 runs. This was a big improvement on last season when only two players exceeded 300 runs.

The brunt of the bowling was carried out by M. Parry, G. Parry and S. Meier, who each collected over 45 wickets and fully deserved their success in this department. Two performances stand out in my mind, firstly, G. Parry who bowled unchanged for one complete afternoon, taking 15 wickets for 72 runs from 32 overs and secondly, the hostile and sustained effort of the two pace men, S. Meier and G. Parry, who bowled unchanged throughout the afternoon in the final against Burwood.

The wicket-keeping was in the excellent hands of R. Brown who tallied 26 wickets consisting of 21 caught and 5 stumped. This brilliant keeper was one of the direct reasons for our success.

Fielding and catching were of a very high order and it was in this department that several matches were won. Particularly important was the fine slip catching by G. Parry and W. Balfour who proved specialists in this position. Other outstanding fieldsmen were D. Corbett, A. Mines and A. Ingleby.

I would again like to thank the team for their support and co-operation which made my job much easier. A finer bunch of chaps it would be hard to find and I deem it a great pleasure and privilege to have been associated with them as their skipper, and I extend to them all my thanks and congratulations.

In conclusion I would also like to thank our President, Mr. T. Haggett, for the interest he has shown in the club, and our capable Secretary, Mr. J. Whitford, for his untiring work and assistance in all matters relating to the Club.

between wickets.

M. PARRY - Like brother George, "Mo" had a really fine season scoring 416 runs and taking 46 wickets with his off-spinners. Was also Vice-Captain and ably led team on two occasions. A very big help to his skipper at all times.

S. MEIER - This big fast-medium bowler again had an outstanding season with the ball, taking 49 wickets and in three seasons has now taken 140 wickets. A keen cricketer who thoroughly

deserved his success.

- W. BALFOUR First season on turf and soon showed his natural batting ability. Very forceful batsman especially strong on leg side. A sound slip fieldsman and useful leg-break bowler.
- R. BROWN Brilliant wicket-keeper who tallied 26 wickets consisting of 21 caught and 5 stumped. This ex-Victorian first-grader also scored 285 runs with his sound batting. A very popular and fine sportsman.

A. INGLEBY - Did not show true form with bat until end of season. Has too much ability for lean period to continue. Very fine

fieldsman close to wicket and good team-man.

B. STAPLES - This keen young player had limited opportunities with the ball in his first season. I feel that given the chance he would prove an asset to any team. Very improved fieldsman. Next season may be his.

K. MEIER - Shaped well with bat and has plenty of confidence. Is natural left-hander and should go for his shots. Safe fieldsman. Experience gained will prove invaluable next

season.

A. MINES - Again showed he has ability but just cannot get going. Needs big score to give return of confidence. Brilliant

fieldsman and popular clubman.

- S. ALLEN Is capable of getting more runs than he did, and I hope to see him strike form next year. Was first season on turf and must learn to use feet against slow bowlers. A safe fieldsman.
- G. PRYCE Only played three matches before retiring and did not have time to reach top form. We were very sorry to lose George.
