PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Gentlemen,

The 1980-81 Season has, I feel, been a year which will have a dramatic effect on the future of our Club. Firstly, the aquisition of our second turf wicket is the turning point for the future, in as much as it now gives up and coming junior cricketers the opportunity to play a higher standard of cricket and will enable our Club to field four teams in the M. & S. competition.

The re-introduction of our "C" Grade team this season produced an influx of new players from local junior teams and the ability and potential shown by these new players has strengthened our Club considerably and augurs well for the future.

We must strive to field a fourth team in 1981-82 as with the structure of cricket in New South Wales changing whereby in the very near future, there will be three Divisions of Grade Cricket in the metropolitan area, each Club in each of these Grades must field four teams. It is proposed by the N.S.W.C.A. that the first and second Division will comprise of the existing Grade Clubs, with the Shire Competition becoming the Third Division. Promotion and relegation, based on Club Championship points is also proposed, therefore we must endeavour to build our Club up now, to be in a position to form part of the restructuring and we must have the ultimate aim of achieving promotion.

Our teams' performances this season were very encouraging even though it was very disappointing to be the "bridesmaid" again in the "A" Grade. To lose the final by 4 runs after being Minor Premiers was a bitter pill to swallow particularly after a magnificent win in the semi-final and some fine individual performances in the final. A great many comments have been made since the final regarding bad umpiring decisions costing us the match, but let us be honest and face up to the fact that we did not play well enough to win - when the match overall is analysed, the bowlers did their job and

did so magnificently, but we lost because we did not score runs and you just can't win finals without runs on the board. In fact reviewing all matches this season, our bowlers got us to the final evidenced by their individual figures as against our batting figures where the highest aggregate was 257 and this was by one of our bowlers.

We can be consoled by the fact that we still probably have the youngest "A" Grade side in the Competition and most team members have not reached their best. As mentioned, it was a bowlers year highlighted by 20 year old David Harvey taking 53 wickets at the incredible average of 9.3 - to illustrate David's ability, he has now taken 212 wickets in 5½ seasons - look out George Parry, your Club record of 613 wickets is in jeopardy. Add to David's bowling 145 runs and 10 catches and we have the 1980-81 Player of the Year (the youngest ever) congratulations David, a tremendous effort. Also a big "well done" must go to two of the best all rounders in the competition, the Johnson Brothers - if all players had the dedication and will to win as Ron and Ian, the Premiership would be a formality.

The "B" Grade performed admirably considering the large number of young players having their first experience on turf wickets, seven of the team being under 18 with three being under 16 and it was the younger ones who produced the goods. A special mention to two of these new players for their first up performances - Stephen Laing who was Runner up in the Batting Aggregate 330 runs at 27.5 plus 21 wickets at 17.2 and Lance Pendreigh who finished second in the Bowling Aggregate with 38 wickets at 12.2, this was a top effort for a "slowie" - Lance also scored 212 runs. Both these players started the Season in "C" Grade and won promotion to the "B"s and will be pushing the "A" Graders next year.

Like all teams selected last, our "C" Grade side suffered from constant team changes, with no less than 26 players turning out during the year, plus having four different Captains during the season due to promotions and unavailability. This makes it

difficult to mould a team, however they finished only 16 points off the semis and on three occasions missed out, due to bad weather, gaining points against lowly placed teams. We have a tremendous amount of ability and potential in this side and there is going to be a lot of pressure on players in "A" and "B" Grade for their positions.

A pleasing aspect this year was the organisation and support of our social and fund raising activities. In the past one or two members of the Club were left to arrange everything, but it proved this year how we can be successful in this area when everyone pitches in and does their bit.

I would like to say a special thank you to Bob Blake, Maurie Batcheler and Scotty Ure of Blake and Batcheler Sales Pty Ltd, Kensington for their most generous gesture of printing our Annual Report. The presentation of our report would be the envy of many Clubs, and all our members would fully realise what this gesture means to our Club.

My thanks to our Management Committee for all their efforts, in particular to Alan Smeed and Ian Johnson for the extra jobs they carried out.

Finally my thanks to all Club Members for the manner in which the game was played, everyone can take credit for the way they represented to Club. We have a great Club and with the style of members we have, it will stay great.

One of the success stories of the season, Lance's consistent performances in "C" Grade earned him promotion to the "B"s where he continued to take wickets and finished at the top of the "B" Grade averages with 20 at 11.4 and overall, 38 wickets for the season at 12.2 to finish 2nd highest wicket taker in the Club. For a slow bowler these are top figures, but for a very young slow bowler playing turf cricket for the first time, they are magnificent figures.
