PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Gentlemen,

It is with pleasure that I present this Eighteenth Annual Report of the Club.

The results of the 1968-9 season were encouraging in that all three teams finished higher on the competition table than in the previous season. In the Club Championship we finished in 8th position as against 10th in 1967-8. The improved overall performance can be attributed to an influx of a number of promising young players into the Club and also to the fact that many of the more senior members produced their top form.

The influx of young players was due mainly to our new association with the Auburn Churches Cricket Club which resulted in a number of players from that Club having their first season on turf. Two of these players, David Stanford and Lyle Fry performed extremely well while others who showed great promise were John McKeon, Tony Ostler, Mick Young and Ray Gentles. John Reynolds was another young player with potential who also joined the Club.

The "A" Grade side finished the season in 8th place after having been in 10th place in the previous two seasons. The side's performances were generally an improvement on the previous season. It was extremely pleasing to see Arthur Rudgley capture 50 wickets after just missing out last year. His player-of-the-year award was well deserved. It was also good to see the skipper, Les Marks, get back amongst the runs.

The "B" Grade had its best season on record, finishing in 4th position and being only two competition points from 2nd place. The side was near the competition lead all season and always looked to have a chance of making the final. It had an unlucky loss to Lane Cove and a lapse of form against Lindfield but it met its real Waterloo in the two crucial games against Burwood which in turn was unlucky to strike bad weather in the final when in a winning position.

All other matches were won and most of them in a convincing fashion. Contrary to the position in nearly every previous season, the team's strength lay in its batting. This is borne out by the averages both of the team and of its batsmen. Perhaps next season we will see the combination of batting and bowling performances required to take out the premiership.

The "C" grade team, while still not finishing high up the ladder, was also improved on the previous season and we look forward to continued improvement next season. The loss of some players towards the end of the season made the team's position difficult. It is hoped that we can obtain a number of new players next season so that the performances of the "C" Grade, as well as the other teams, may continue to rise.

The Club's thanks again go to Auburn Council, the Combined Sports Committee and the groundsmen for the continued good condition of the ground and pitch. The new boundary fences and the resultant slight reduction in size of the ground drew favourable comments from all. We looked forward to the proposed new sightscreens as a further improvement to the playing conditions.

My thanks also go to the Committee for its continued sound management of the Club's activities and finances despite a number of recent changes in ex-ecutive positions.

In conclusion, I take the opportunity of wishing the Club success and continued good fellowship in the coming season.

"B" GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

Once again I have the opportunity of submitting the "B" Grade report for the 1968-69 season.

It gives me pleasure to report that the "B"'s experienced one of the best season on record but firstly, on behalf of the team, I would like to offer congratulations to the Roseville and Lane Cove Clubs for their respective successes in the "A" and "B" grade and also to Southern Districts for taking out the "C" grade honours in their first year.

The teams performance this year was very much improved on previous seasons and to finish in 4th position was indeed a good effort.

Our success was due to a real team effort although there were many fine individual performances and I feel particular mention should be made of Phil Perkins, my vice-captain, who became only

the second player in the "B" grade to score over 500 runs in a season. Phil not only won the batting average but scored his second century with the Club and figured prominently in two of the three new "B" grade partnerships created this season as well as being runner up in The Player of the Year Award - really a good performance.

Unlike past seasons our batting was our main strength, as can be seen by the number of good averages recorded, our fielding was of a very high standard but unfortunately the lack of penetration in our bowling let us down on a number of occasions.

Finally, I would like to sincerely thank the entire team for their wholehearted support and enthusiastic approach to every game. Also a special personal thanks to Eric Howard for his tremendous assistance at Mona Park.

DAVE TRIBOLET

THE "B" GRADE PLAYERS

PHIL PERKINS (V.C.) Phil had his best ever season and in scoring 522 runs at an average of 32.6 he finished with both the highest aggregate and average. Together with David Noyes, he created a new "B" grade opening partnership of 178 against Epping and also participated in another record partnership with Pat Percy.

Phil proved that a consistent opening batsman is of immense value to a team and his efforts were largely responsible for the majority of our successes. He scored his second "ton" and was runner up in the Player of the Year Award.

ERIC BURGIN The "veteran" of the side was another who experienced a very good season - 417 runs at an average of 29.8 speaks for itself. Eric rarely failed and he held the batting together on a number of occasions. His experience definitely assisted the team and we look forward to him having another good run next year.

The "B" Grade Players (Contd)

WALLY SHEPHERD Due to studies Wally only played six games during the season yet scored 217 runs at an average of 31.0 and finished second in the batting average. Scored a great 91 not out against Lindfield and with Ron Turnbull set a new 7th wicket partnership of 99. One of the Club's best fieldsmen and took some great catches in "his" position at leg slip.

PAT PERCY Pat proved again his value to the team with his consistent batting, finishing with an average of 25.9 and was the mainstay of a number of good partnerships. He figured in the new 5th wicket partnership of 116 against Bexley and is still one of our best fieldsmen.

BOB HADLEY Bob, still having trouble with a back injury, did not perform as well as expected, although he still finished with a batting average of 22.6. Was very reliable with the ball, but had limited opportunities to perform - Bob's fielding was first class and there is no doubt that he is one of the best slip fieldsmen in the competition.

BRIAN MOORE Our number one spinner, Brian took the most number of wickets and also won the bowling average. His 7 for 35 against Canterbury was a great effort and a good example of accurate spin bowling. Brian's batting was not as good as expected, but was a very useful "stopgap" opener.

JOHN SCORGIE John's value to the team was twofold, as a batsman and wicketkeeper - probably our most aggressive batsman, John scored well in most innings. Kept wickets very well and made some fine stumpings. Unfortunately John has been transferred to the country by his employer and we will miss his "shape" next season.

RON TURNBULL Turned in a very good all round performance in his first season on turf. With the bat, Ron scored 201 runs at an average of 18.2 and took 23 wickets at 17.0 a piece. He gave a magnificent bowling performance against Bexley in taking 8 for 65 off 20 consecutive overs. A young player with a very bright future.

The "B" Grade Players (Contd)

STEVE HOLMES Steve only played in the last six matches, yet finished second to Brain Moore in both the bowling average and most number of wickets. Turned in a very good effort of 6 for 57 off 17 overs against Canterbury and will be a far better bowler when he learns to put "fire" into his bowling.

TONY OSTLER Had the unusual experience of playing a number of games in each grade and ironically performed the best in the few games he played in "A" grade. Also having his first season on turf, Tony is another young player with a very bright future and will, without a doubt, improve considerably.

GARY SIMMONS Garry's "other" interests restricted him to only six games and naturally his inconsistent appearances affected his performances. However, he took 24 wickets at an average of 17.8 and bowled well on most occasions. Once his concentration improves, the ability he has will really show out.

JOHN REYNOLDS John was another young player having his first season on turf and alternated between the "B"'s and the "C"'s. A left arm medium pace bowler with a lot of ability, John will be a real asset to any side with a little more experience.

<u>DAVID NOYES</u> Even though David only played three games before his promotion to the "A"'s, I feel a special mention must be given as he averaged 53 runs in his 4 innings, including a magnificent century opening the innings against Epping.

My thanks to the following players who assisted the "B" grade during the season: Ron Johnson, Ken James, Ray Holmes, Lyle Fry, Graham Berry, Peter Mooney, Mick Young, Ray Gentles, Keith Harrison.
