The wicket and outfield at Mona Park was kept in excellent order thanks to the untiring efforts of groundsman Rube Finch.

Attendance at Committee Meetings were excellent and the Club's thanks are extended to our worthy President, Tom Haggett, and his wife for their co-operation in this respect.

## CAPTAIN'S REPORT.

In submitting my first Captain's Report, I do so with satisfaction, as once again the Club featured in the Finals. After finishing second in the Competition proper we were defeated outright by Ryde at Mona Park in the Semi-Final by 38 runs.

We only have ourselves to blame for our defeat as our batting failed in both innings after our bowling and excellent fielding had dismissed Ryde for a total of 251 runs in two innings.

Our batting over the Season was not as consistent as In previous years especially towards the end of the Season. This is born out in as much as in the last six matches our highest score for an innings was 141 runs. George Parry was our most consistent batsman heading the averages for the first time. Alan Ingleby batted better this Season than previously and Athol Mines showed that he is a better batsman than his averages suggest. Bill Balfour played one of the best knocks seen for our Club against Roseville at Roseville Oval scoring 112 Not Out, (82 Runs in Boundaries), with Merv. Jenson, (52 Runs), they broke the 5th wicket partnership for the Club.

The bowling once again was of a very high standard. Merv. Black, only sixteen and having his first season on turf wickets, was our star bowler finishing the Season with the remarkable figures of 33 wickets at an average of 8.76. No doubt Mervyn will try his luck with Cumberland next season and if he should decide on this, we wish him wall.

Merv. Jenson, another newcomer to the Club, showed promise with the ball and with more opportunities next season he will prove an acquisition.

Our fielding was of Test Match standard and the success of our bowlers must be shared with them.

We had a number of younger players, namely, Norman Lewis, John Skinner, Ron West, Ray Hall and Merv. Black, having their first season with the Club. These youngsters were as keen as mustard and although their averages were nothing startling, next season will see a big improvement.

In conclusion, I would like to thank the team for their co-operation and sportsmanship. I don't think a more harmonious team ever existed. I would also like to thank our President, Mr. T. Haggett, and our Secretary, Mr. J. Whitford, for the way the Club was run off the field.
