PRESIDENTS REPORT

Gentlemen,

The 1978/79 Season was one of mixed fortunes. After being informed by the N.S.W.C.A. that our nomination for a 'C' Grade team had been rejected we found ourselves in the awkward position of having to select two teams from approximately 30 players. This was disappointing particularly to those players who initially missed selection and also to those who were selected in only a limited number of matches during the Season. The only good point coming out of this was the strong competition between players for positions in the teams throughout the Season and this was reflected by the final result of having both 'A' and 'B' Grades in the semi-finals and the Club winning the Club Championship, the first time since 1962/63.

Missing out again on a Premiership was to say the least, very disappointing however taking out the Club Championship was to me and I am sure to every Club Member, a very satisfying and pleasing result. This achievement was a reflection of the team spirit and harmony within the Club and credit for this must go to every Member but particularly to those who were stood down regularly due to the number of players available.

The 'A's started in great form with three first innings wins, a washed out draw and an outright in the first five rounds but then experienced a slight slump with a couple of draws and losses, however they finished equal first with Lindfield and Wentworthville but were relegated to third on percentage. The result of the semi-final was, as has been the case during the past few Seasons, determined by the weather with the second day being washed out completely thereby putting Lindfield into the final.

Presidents Report (Cont'd..)

The 'B' Grade had a similar start to the 'A's with five first innings wins and a draw after six rounds. They finished in second place and reached the final which was the first time for an Auburn 'B' Grade side. Unfortunately the good cricket played throughout the year by the team was not carried into the final and they were well beaten by a team who played 'final' cricket.

The making of the semis and taking out the Club Championship this year highlights the importance of picking up points early in the Season. Over the years points are hard to come by towards the end of the Season and the early leaders always seem to reach the finals.

Unfortunately I have to report that the possibility of having a 'C' Grade team next year is, at this stage, not good. After more contact and followup with Auburn Council plus the Auburn Combined Sports Committee it appears that these two organisations are determined not to even try and assist us and it seems that their interests lie in all other sports except Cricket. It is not difficult to feel bitter towards the Council and Sports Committee as it has been nine years since we requested their assistance in obtaining an additional turf wicket and during that period the amount of money poured into facilities for other sports in the Municipality would be staggering. We have, however, nominated for a 'C' Grade for the coming Season and we can only hope that sufficient neutral grounds can be found to enable us to have a third side.

There have been developments regarding the format of the Municipal and Shire Competition and some changes will come into effect for the 1979/80 Season. A number of meetings have been held during the off season of representatives of all Shire Clubs and it is intended that we form ourselves into a Council and have more say in the running of the M&S Competition. At this stage, all Clubs are represented by a

four man Committee and discussions and meetings have already been held between this Committee and the N.S.W.C.A. - these meetins will continue and we are all sure that the proposals and possible changes to the formal and the running of our Competition will not only benefit all Shire Clubs but Cricket generally. I hope to have more details and information to advise regarding these points at the Annual General Meeting.

Finally, I would like to express my thanks and appreciation to all Club Members for their efforts this year and in the manner in which they represented the Club and a particular thank you to the Management Committee for the excellent work done throughout the Season.

A disappointing end to a great Season. To have played extremely good cricket throughout the entire season and then to finish with one really bad game in the final was to say the least disappointing. But congratulations to Macquarie University who after just making the final four took their chances and finished up with the Premiership.

THE "B" GRADE PLAYERS

DAVID VEIGEL (Vice Captain)

A good season by David scoring 308 runs at 22 and his constant good scores particularly in the middle of the season greatly contributed to our high innings totals. His knock of 69 against Canterbury was a first class effort and with Steve Finch put on 125 to set a new "B" Grade record for the 5th wicket. David was also our keeper early in the season but really shon in the field with some great catches after Finchy took over the gloves. David thinks well on the field and his advice and assistance helped me and the team considerably.

PETER KLEIN

One of the success stories of the season. Peter after a lean previous season as a middle order batsman took on the job as opener this year with tremendous results. He failed to reach double figures only twice during the year and scored in excess of 30 in five of his nine digs. His consistancy won him promotion to open for the "A"s but he did not enjoy the same success and we had him back (gratefully) for the last few games. Peter wasn't called upon to bowl much this year however when required he did a good job. His fielding was good but not quite up to the standard we are used to from Peter.

LINDSAY REES

When a good player has a lean trot, nothing goes right and this certainly was the case with Lindsay this season. It was a shame to see such a talented batsman unable to get going yet every time he went to the crease we all expected that this was going to be the innings we had been waiting for, but unfortunately except for one good knock, it didn't eventuate. Lindsay is too good a player to let this season worry him and all I can say is that opposition bowlers had better beware next season. A special thanks to Lindsay for his attitude to the team and the game, especially in the field - he sets a tremendous example of enthusiasm and dedication and in my mind is still the best fieldsman in the Club.

BRETT TRIBOLET

A top all round season by Brett, his bowling has matured considerably and he is now thinking extremely well when bowling. At no stage during the season did a batsman get on top of him due to his good line and length and to have

an average of only 2.8 runs scored off his 96 overs was an excellend effort for a spin bowler. His 6/15 off nine overs against Lindfield which included taking four wickets in 18 balls for 2 runs was a matchwinner. Brett's accurary and consistancy earnt him the Club trophy for the bowling average and he brought up his 100 wickets for the Club. His batting was disappointing early in the season, however when promoted to open the innings he came good and in most matches got us off to a good start - a little more self confidence is required in the batting department. Another pleasing aspect, especially to me, was his 100% improvement in the field - he took the most number of catches in the field and generally fielded extremely well to finish high up in the points table. Congratulations on a fine season.

STEVE FINCH

It is a pity to Steve that he was unavailable for the first two rounds because in my opinion his keeping would have won him the fielding award. I consider it was the best and most consistant exhibition of wicketkeeping I have seen in Shires for many years. His figures of eight catches and six stumpings do not tell the story as his chances were limited due to type of bowling attack we had, but if he missed one chance well I can't remember it. As a batsman again he had a top season, having 12 innings he scored 248 runs at an average of 24.8 and put a lot of solidarity into our batting. His attitude and determination when batting is something that quite a few others should follow. His best knock was a great 69 against Minor Premiers Canterbury which resulted in the record breaking fifth wicket partnership with "Veigs". Well done Steve.

BERNIE CLIFTON

The other part of our main bowling attack, Bernie only played in the first six rounds with the "B"s as due to his success he was promoted to the "A" Grade and kept his spot well in the top side for the rest of the Season. He started the season in great form taking 6/19 in the first match and continued with this form to head the "B" Grade averages with 19 wickets at 9.1. Bernie was another bowler who batsmen couldn't score off, averaging 2.2 off his 78 overs. Bernie also proved this year what a good all rounder he is - batting at No.3 or opening he was extremely successful and headed the "B"s batting average with 185 runs in 6 innings at an average of 37, with a top score of 66 N.O. against Pennant Hills. An extremely valuable member of the team.

WAL SHEPHERD

Wal, on paper didn't score the runs he normally does although he only played in 8 games. Due to the strength of our batting this year Wal had to bat far too low in the order and most times he was in the position of having to push the score along which we all know is not his style. Wal's fielding again was top class as he is still one of the best close to the wicket fieldsmen in the Comp. and overall has a very good attitude to the game.

Pete had an unhappy season being one of the palyers who suffered from the glut of palyers. Unfortunately for Pete after such a good previous season with the bat, he couldn't get going in the early matches he played and as we all know vying for positions in the team was a cut-throat affair and consequently he missed the best part of the season. But Pete has a bright future and I expect to see him back in that No.l Batting spot next year.
