PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Gentlemen,

I am pleased to present this the Twentieth Annual Report of the Auburn Shire Cricket Club.

The 1970-71 season was again one of mixed fortunes, the "A" and "C" grade sides finished in the lower half of the competition and the "B" grade just missed on making the final for the first time ever, finishing in third place.

It is difficult to understand the reasons the "A" 's did not finish in a higher position in the table, as the team consists of many competent cricketers who as individuals had some good performances.

The "B" 's had one of their best seasons and but for striking a wet wicket in the crucial redraw match, the team may have made the final. Congratulations to Ron Johnson on winning the Player of the Year award in his first season with the Club.

The "C" grade had an up and down season, and as in the past was the "nursery" for the young players, many of whom turned in some fine performances.

Mention should be made of financial matters. The Club suffered a net loss of about \$70.00 on its activities during the year. This is somewhat disturbing when it is considered that we raised over \$150.00 on the usual fund-raising competition and received a grant of \$80.00 from the NSW Cricket Association. The main reason for the large deficit can be attributed to the ever increasing cost of new equipment, balls alone now costing about \$200.00 a season.

The incoming Committee will therefore be giving consideration to an increase in annual subscriptions and weekly fees. Any increase can be kept to a minimum if all members give full support to our fund-raising competition and if they also ensure that all fees are paid promptly as they fall due. In this regard it should be remembered that those whose job it is to collect fees are in the Club to play cricket too and they should not be called upon to "chase up" other players for outstanding fees.

Once again I would like to thank the Auburn Council, the Combined Sports Committee and the Mona Park groundsmen for their assistance and co-operation.

I would also like to thank the members of the Clubs Management Committee without whose efforts the Club could not operate.

Finally I wish the Club success in the forthcoming season and I am sure that, if all players apply themselves to the fullest of their ability, we can confidently look forward to improved results.

"A" GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

It gives me pleasure to present this report on behalf of the "A" grade players.

Firstly I must congratulate University of N.S.W. on their premier-ship win. They were by far the best side we played and in my opinion fully deserved their win. While on the subject of congratulations I must not forget our "B" grade side, who if not for bad weather in the last round before the re-draw would surely have been minor premiers.

The "A" grade started the season in fine style with an outright win in the first round and then an unlucky 1st innings loss against Roseville. At this stage we looked set for a really good season but then our form deserted us. It is difficult to pin point the problem of exactly what is lacking in our side but I feel that it is probably that we are a side of good average players without the 2 or 3 outstanding players which are necessary to make the difference of a winning side or a losing side.

This was the first time in my experience with Shire cricket where a team has forfeited without any prior notice and for the benefit of the entire competition I hope the last.

On the brighter side of things I must thank all those players who played with the "A" grade during the season. Their co-operation with me and the manner in which they approached the game was first class.

With a continuation of this attitude and a bit more application I am sure we will win a lot more matches.

THE "A" GRADE PLAYERS

LEON WEBSTER (V. Capt.) Leon had one of those seasons with the bat that all batsmen seem to have at one time or another. After a reasonably good start he had a run of the horrors and lost all confidence. I am sure with the season behind him we can look to bigger and better things next year. He bowled with his usual consistency.

JOHN ROSS John's batting had real substance throughout the season and he topped the aggregate with 309 runs. He had a particularly good match against Canterbury with innings of 41 and 62.

TED SUCHY Ted showed on a couple of occasions this season, glimpses of the type of batting we know he is capable of. He seemed to particularly enjoy Eppings bowling where he scored 36 on each of the occasions we played them.

RAY GENTLES Once again this young player showed us that the main attribute required in a batsman is concentration and application. Ray just simply does not like getting out and sells his innings dearly. Even though his highest score for this season was 40 from 14 innings he was still able to top the batting average. Surely there is a lesson to be learned by other players from his example.

HILTON HARRISON Back in the side after a long break and he started to find his form with the ball again towards the end of the season. He batted consistently throughout and obviously will be a force to be reckoned with next year. His fielding in front of the wicket was the best I have seen in a long time.

BOB BRIGGS Once again Bob's bowling, fielding and batting were all first class. His 44 against Roseville included 7 fours and 2 sixes. If Bob could contain himself and pick the ball to hit as he did in this innings he would surely be one of the best run scorers in the Club.

LES MARKS Les had an interrupted season, only playing 5 games in the A grade. It was great to see him apply himself in the game against Epping which once more showed us just what a capable batsman this player is.

THE "B" GRADE PLAYERS

BOB HADLEY (V Capt.) Bob did not have one of his better seasons, although his bowling and fielding were still top class. His batting was disappointing, considering the ability he possesses and we look forward to better results next year. As Vice Captain, his advice and assistance was greatly appreciated.

PETER MOONEY One player who did have a good season — Peter was our consistent opening batsman and his concentration and determination is an example a lot more players should follow. This same concentration applied to his fielding and Peter deservedly won the trophy for the Club's best fieldsman.

RON JOHNSON Having his 1st season with the Club, Ron scooped the pool of trophies — He won both the batting and bowling aggregates and averages as well as taking the Player of the Year Award. His bowling was the most consistent and penetrative I have seen for a long time, and his batting was in the same class — examples of his ability were when in 3 consecutive matches he took a total of 26 wickets for 170 runs and his two memorable batting efforts were against Canterbury when, with Gus Brazier 87 runs were scored in 44 minutes off 8 overs to win outright, and against Wentworthville his great 67 was the mainstay of our innings.

DAVID VEIGEL David is a young player who is improving with every game. He has all the batting strokes, but he needs to improve his concentration and be a bit more patient at the crease. He played some good innings, the highlight being a magnificent 66 N.O. against Pennant Hills. David is also a good and keen fieldsman in any position.

STEVE HOLMES Steve alternated between the "A" 's and "B" 's and only played 6 matches with us, but he still took 20 wickets at an average of 13.9. There is no doubt Steve's performances would improve if his condition was better. His batting is underated as was shown in the last two games of the season.

WAL SHEPHERD Wal finished 2nd in the batting averages with 21.3 and although this is a good average, he only batted 9 times due to University studies, and subsequently did not do as well as we have come to expect. He did well with the ball when called upon to open the bowling and he is still one of the best close-to-the-wicket fieldsman in the competition.

PAUL STUTCHBURY Came to us from the "A" grade and due to the number of medium-fast bowlers in our team, Paul did not have much opportunity with the ball. However he retained his spot in the side with his batting and his all round ability was an asset to the team.

ALAN SMEE Alan was having his first year with the Club and was another who suffered from lack of bowling due to the numbers. He was a hard hitting batsman who played some good knocks and was one of the best fieldsmen in the team.

GARY BLACK Gary only played in 7 games with the "B" 's but still showed his ability behind the stumps with some good dismissals — there is no doubt that this young player will develop into one of the best 'keepers' the Club has had.

GUS BRAZIER Due to alternating between the "A" 's and "B" 's, Gus did not bat sufficient times to appear in the averages, however he scored 231 runs for 5 times out to average 46.2. He scored a magnificent 100 not out against Roseville which included one of the biggest "sixers" ever hit on Mona Park.

JOHN COOPER John also only played in a limited number of "B" Grade matches, but his wicket-keeping was of a very high standard. He figured in 10 dismissals but his ability to "stand up" to the fast bowlers and his understanding with Ron Johnson resulted in him being responsible for many dismissals.
