Mr. and Mrs. Perkins and Mr. N. Hoskins again provided afternoon tea at all home matches besides making their home available for meetings and Social Do's during the season. The social and club spirit of the team has increased 100% since Don instituted these functions and anyone who neglects to be present at one of these get-togethers messes a great treat.

The attendance of the Management Committee each month is remarkably consistent and some of the "wags" attribute the attendance to the cooking of Mrs. "P". However, its very heartening to the officer of the Club.

The team was again capably lead by Captain Don Perkins, who set a fine example to his team members with his performances.

The Club is greatly indebted to Mr. Bolstridge, who has given a great amount of publicity to our Scores, Comments and Fixtures; to local businessmen for their financial and moral support; and also to Allan Barnes of the N.S.W.C.A., for continued assistance and advice.

The team should have filled a higher position on the competition table than it did. Still we have only ourselves to blame, as it was through our own weaknesses, that we lost when victory was in sight on several occasions.

One particular disappointment to me was the non-attendance of selected players, thus leaving the team a man short on at least four instances. It is to be hoped that next season's selectors will keep this in mind when selecting teams.

Our batting was fairly good for the first few wickets, but deteriorated badly from there on. Only two batsmen exceeded 300 runs namely D. Perkins, 426 and G. Parry, 387. M. Parry would have scored over 300 if he had been available for the full season.

The bowling was generally reliable with G. Parry and S. Meier providing the brunt of the attack and on occasions being assisted by D. Perkins, G. Pryce, A. Ingleby and R. Baker.

The wicket-keeping was in the capable hands of N. Howard, who shows distinct promise, and for one match, by the energetic D. Corbett.

Our fielding and catching, with the exception of slips, was generally speaking, safe and at times brilliant. D. Corbett and G. Parry were outstanding; R. Baker always a safe catch and A. Ingleby and A. Mines also fielded excellently.

I would like to thank the team for their whole-hearted support and co-operation which made my job during the season very much easier.

Altogether we had a very pleasant season with a reasonable amount of success, but more important still, a year of pleasant associations. The good fellowship of the team had much to do with any success achieved.

PERSONALITIES. (By Don Perkins)

- G. PARRY: Again leading all-rounder, scoring 387 runs and taking 29 wickets. Brilliant slip fieldsman and Vice-Captain for second successive season. A big halp to the Captain on and off the field.
- M. PARRY: Excellent batsman and good fieldsman; unfortunately missed a number of matches due to an operation to the knee. Footwork and strokemaking best in team.
- L. McDONALD: Showed improvement on last season, especially when batting early in innings. A solid fieldsman and sound club man, who should get many more runs next season.
- S. MEIER: Again leading wicket-taker and stock bowler collecting 39 wickets with medium paced bowling. Ankle injury affected his bowling during latter half of season. An excellent club man who should improve his fielding. His batting has improved.
- in INGLEBY: Solid batsman, who had rather lean season with bat and far below his ability. Useful change bowler and outstanding fieldsman close to wicket. Humorist of team.
- D. CORBETT: Forceful left-hand batsman, who believes in hitting the ball hard and often. Missed a number of matches through working. One of best fieldsmen I have seen.
- G. PRYCE: Left-hand, medium paced bowler, took 15 wickets.

 Hard to score off and very accurate, safe field. Should get more runs.
- N. HOWARD: Keeping wickets for the first time, showed improvement as season progressed and could develope into a first class keeper. Batting was a disappointment as Nev. has a vast array of shots but must use feet more to slow bowling.
- R. BAKER: Left-hand batsman, who shaped well but just cannot overcome a run of outs which every batsman experiences. Excellent catch and safe field; also useful slow left-hand bowler.
- A. MINES: Forceful left-hand batsman, who should improve next season as this was first time on turf. First rate fieldsman and an acquisition to the club.
- R. TREEBY: Started season well but batting fell away later.
 Footwork needs improving; has good defence; sound fieldsman.
- S. SCORGIE: Unfortunately withdrew after first four or five matches. Good spin bowler.
- H. OLIVER: Was permanent reserve, who played three matches. Also fielded when players were absent and umpired when regular Umpires were not present. Deserves many thanks from the club for his fine sportsmanship.
- W. TEBBUTT: Withdrew early in season before he had reached form with bat. His fine fielding was missed.
- P. CAHILL and J. CARTIFF: Each helped the club out when we were short handed. To each of them, many thanks.
