## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Another season without the 'flag' but as in past years, still a successful one in many ways.

At least all teams were consistent, one finishing fourth, three finishing fifth and our position on the Club Championship table was also fifth.

The "A" Grade were probably the most unfortunate having three games 'washed out' the second day towards the end of the season which contributed greatly to missing the final four. It was a good effort by this team considering the number of changes made from the previous season whereby experienced players were replaced for one reason or another by very young players who not only deserved their promotion, but took the opportunity and performed admirably. Congratulations to the new captain Ken Collins for his efforts with such an inexperienced team and for his encouragement to the young players.

Our only side to make the four was the "B" Grade and this was achieved by good cricket being played in a positive manner by the team. Unfortunately after playing tremendous cricket in the first innings of the semi to have a comfortable lead, the match was lost by a disastrous second innings batting display - there was no doubt in my mind that the main reason for this happening was sheer inexperience as again the team was very young. All players in the team would have learned a lot from this one match and this alone will assist them greatly in the future. Irrespective of the final result it was still a top effort in reaching the final four.

The "C" Grade was another to just miss out on the four - again the weather played a big part, particularly in the final two games when so much time was lost. However all team members should be pleased with their effort and many of these players will, with this season behind them achieve higher goals.

With the introduction of a "D" Grade competition our fourth selected team put up a top showing particularly in view of the large number of players the team was forced to use during the season - with constant changes and unavailability in the higher grades, it is not easy to have a team perform to its full ability. However all credit to this team as a whole for their good showing.

There were many fine performances during the season with quite a number of records being broken and personal goals achieved and it was particularly pleasing to see for the first time in many years, a century scored in each Grade.

On the debit side, we experienced two areas which had a detrimental effect on the Club - firstly the break ins at the ground which cost us a lot of money in stolen property and secondly a disturbing aspect of on field behaviour. The latter problem has not occurred in our Club before and will not occur again - our Club enjoys a very good reputation and the childish actions of one or two players can very quickly ruin the Club as a whole. Even though it may have been isolated incidents only, it must cease and if any players cannot comply with the Club's standard of behaviour and sportsmanship, then I strongly suggest those players look for another Club.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT (Continued)

I would like to pass on the Club's thanks to Ken Mosten, our Groundsman. Ken had a difficult time early in the season in getting a good batting surface on both grounds, however due to his efforts both tracks became as good as the best in the competition - much appreciated Ken.

A most pleasing aspect of the season was the number of players who "qualified" for the Batting and Bowling Trophies - 11 players scoring over 250 runs and 14 Bowlers taking 20 wickets or more is the most our Club has experienced. With 9 of the 11 Batsmen and 10 of the 14 Bowlers being under 21 years of age indicates the great depth we possess and the tremendous potential our Club has to continue to be a real force in the competition. A special mention to Glen Westerberg who in his first season broke a record which has stood since the year the Club was formed - Glen's 151 n.o. is the Club's highest individual score by a Batsman. Also special thanks to Steve Blomfield for his contribution in maintaining points scores and collating the majority of the report. Blommy's efforts in also recording and having published all Shire results and points tables was widely acknowledged and greatly appreciated by all Shire Clubs.

There has been a number of meetings during the off season between the Shire Clubs and with the N.S.W. Cricket Association and certain changes are to be made to the format of our competition - details will be advised at the A.G.M.

Finally my sincere thanks to the Management Committee for their work and to all players for their efforts - let's continue to play as a team and very soon that elusive premiership will be ours.

### Des Roll

Introduced to the A's in Round 7 following top performances in lower grades and immediately produced the goods capturing four wickets against the strong Burwood side in his "A" Grade debut. Des always bowled a good line and he is keen to do well.

Didn't get a lot of opportunity with the bat (who did?) however whenever he did bat, he showed sufficient promise which augers well for the future. Fielded extremely well and has a very strong throwing arm, however his attitude towards "A" Grade commitment can be improved.

### John Ross - Vice Captain (Roscoe)

The most unselfish and knowledgeable cricketer in the Club. A fine on field reader of the game, Roscoe would probably hold his place in "A" Grade on this aspect of his game alone, particularly when advising Bowlers of tactics to employ (if only Roscoe had the ability to bowl)

John really had a disappointing season with the bat aside from his magnificent 91 against Pennant Hills. Even so, he remains as one of the most devastating batsmen in Shires.

A top wicket keeping season highlighted by a memorable performance against Roseville when he virtually dismissed the opposition and breaking a Club record for catches.

Our No. 1 opening bowler who easily won the bowling aggregate, Darryl gave his best in all games and never shirked his job when things weren't going our way. Darryl is a good bowler who can only improve, but just a small tip, think a little more about each batsman you're bowling at, they aren't all the same. Another of our best fieldsman particularly close to the wicket in 'his' position where he took some magnificent catches (some of which were not given).



## THE "C" GRADE PLAYERS

### Glen Clarke

Glen's unavailability through work and injury did not help him show his ability but topping 40 in three of his 5 innings and totalling 147 at an average of 29.4 shows what could have happened if he had played a full season. Glen is also an extremely talented keeper and put in top performance and even when not keeping his outfielding was as good as anyone in the team.

### David Noyes

David made a re-appearance with the Club after a few years absence and was selected in 'A' Grade first up, but in round 2 he suffered a serious injury which cut short his season.
