PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Again I have the honour of reporting on our Club's performances in our thirty first season.

It is disappointing to have to report that we were again unsuccessful in winning a premiership, however I consider this season to be probably our most successful for some time. I say this for a number of reasons, firstly we achieved our aim in fielding a second "C" Grade team with tremendous success - we had another influx of young players who all performed exceptionally well - the administration and financial side of the Club is in a healthy state and the overall performance of the Club this year indicates we are on the verge of an exciting and successful era.

I still maintain our Club has the youngest average age of any Club in Shires and for all teams to perform as well as they did against much more experienced opposition was a wonderful effort by all concerned - and this is why we will improve out of sight in the future.

Of all our teams I guess the "A" Grade had a disappointing season after their great performance the previous year - allowing for some players not performing to their ability, the fielding particularly the catching was not good enough and this had a big bearing on a number of results. The other problem which was very disturbing was the number of times the team was affected by unavailability - sure there were injuries, but there were far too many "other" reasons which not only adversely affected the "A"s, but flowed on down through the other Grades - we cannot expect to win a competition particularly the "A" Grade unless a more dedicated approach is made by some players.

The "B" Grade had a top season, getting off to a flying start with 42 points after seven rounds and leading up until that time, unfortunately our wheels fell off and we only picked up 2 points over the last four matches. However, we made the semis and considering the number of young players in the team, it was a top effort.

With the introduction of our second "C" Grade team, the Club saw fit to try to select two even sides and as it turned out, they both performed admirably - with the "CI"s missing the semis by 2 points and the "CII"s being Minor Premiers. The "CI" team had the worst of the draw by not playing against the two bottom teams also they were more affected by losing players to the higher grades when the unavailability problem kept re-occurring. However, much credit must go to the Captains and all players in these teams for their great season and again I mention that the teams were made up of very young players, most of whom had not played turf cricket before.

It is also pleasing to report that the majority of the trophy winners this year came from the younger brigade and this reinforces the great potential we have in our ranks at the moment.

A disappointing aspect of the season, in fact of the past few seasons, was the non-attendance to mid week practice - on most occasions it was only the new or young players who made the effort - I realise work
