

#### PRESIDENTS REPORT

It certainly gives me pleasure to report on the Clubs performance for season 1989/90.

On the field it was one of our most successful seasons for quite some time, and I would take this opportunity to comment on each of our teams.

The 'A's finally broke through for that coverted trophy - we have been threatening to do this on many occasions and after 26 years of losing semis and finals we finally have our name again on "THE BIG ONE". For the past few years we have been saying we have the players to win the competition and this year it happened due, in my opinion, the the knowledge, experience and ability of Tom Wood - Tom has the knack of getting the players to perform as a team and to the best of their ability. This team is still improving and there is no reason why we can't match our great 'A' team of the sixties and win three in a row.

Ken Collin's 'B' grade were a little unlucky with more than half the final being washed out - the way they were playing they could have beaten any side if all things had been equal, as evidenced by the ease in which they disposed of second placed Wentworthville in the Semi-Final. This is a very talented team, well captained and has a number of players who will be seriously pressing for 'A' selection next year.

The 'C's led by Ray Gentles also made the Semi's, however they did not perform to their ability in the match and could not go on with it. Again a team with several players with ability to play in higher grades and I can see a lot of pressure being applied to players in the 'A' and 'B' next season.

With the 'D' grade being the last selected each match they obviously were hardest hit with pull outs etc in high grades, and in fact 36 players turned out for the 'D's this season. Not withstanding this they were extremely unlucky to miss the final four, by a single point, due to an unexpected result in the final round where a tie occurred after we had won outright. Trevor Lebreton did a great job in his first year as Captin and after a slow start, had the team really firing right up to the final round.

Finishing third in the Club Championship (one win away from first) indicates the overall strength of our Club and this is one Trophy I know we can get our name on again very soon.

Further success was achieved with our under 24 team - winning their three rounds easily and being favourites to win the final, however with the final being washed out they were declared joint premiers. Most of the players in this team qualify again next year and under skipper Demy Sclavos will again give a good account of themselves.

One disappointing aspect is that we still can't get rid of that contagious decease called UNAVAILABILITY - there is still far too many players pulling out of games for what I feel is pretty poor reasons - who knows what more we could have achieved if more players had committed themselves for a full season.

Our finances are in a reasonable state, bearing in mind we have a good stock of new cricket balls for the coming season. Our income this year was boosted by an increase to \$1000.00 in the NSWCA grant, our involvement again in the Golf and a successful raffle. On these points I believe the grant may be reduced next season due to a reduction in NSWCA income, this hopefully will be offset by the Golf where we believe we may be asked to assist in TWO Tournaments next season - I would take this opportunity to say thanks to those past and present players who participated in the Golf and also say how disappointing it was to see so many not turn up after committing themselves. Lastly, our thanks to our sponsor A & W SPORTING SUPPLIES as well as Pat Percey and Ted Suchy for their generous donation of goods for the raffle.

During the season, a re-union dinner was arranged for past and present players and those that didn't make it missed a great night. To commemorate the night medalions were awarded for milestones achieved by players - in this regard the Club is extremely gratefull to Ted Suchy for this magnificent gesture of donations of the medalions. Appreciation also goes to Michael Wood and his sub-committee and also to Leo Farley for organising (with some difficulty) the venue. The success of this night was such, that we have been requested by many members to make this a regular event.

The Club this season accepted an invitation to play against a touring English team, Lincolnshire County Colts at Mona Park - this was a great day and thanks go to many for their assistance, in particular Mark Cotter, Trevor Lebreton, Bob Hadley and our umpire Ted Manning. Our hospitality must have been appreciated as we have been asked to host another touring side, Essex Eagles in January 1991 - we have accepted.

I think we should be very satisfied with the condition of both wickets and outfields at Mona Park this year. Except for one end of the main wicket being a problem on wet days, the general standard was very good and we express our appreciation to Andy Donaldson and the ground staff.

A decision will need to be made at the Annual General Meeting re a name change for the Club - this has come about due to the M & S competition being re-named the Sub-District Competition in the very near future. The concept of Municipal and Shire areas will also change with the possible introductions of new teams - and incidently we are the only Club still with the word Shire in our name.

I would like to express the Clubs thanks to a number of people, in particular:

Finally my thanks to all Club Members for the sportsmanship showed - you should all be proud of your efforts.

#### 'A' GRADE CAPTAINS REPORT 1989-90

It's with great pleasure that I sit down to pen this report, happily secure in the knowledge that after an absence of 26 years, our team has brought the elusive PREMIERSHIP back to the Club.

The combination of some very experienced cricketers blended with a number of "up & coming" players, proved to be the correct recipe, to lift the team from last season's 12th position on the competition table to first this year.

After assessing the comparative strengths of the opposing teams, I believe that we were, in fact, the best allround combination in the competition. Most of the other sides had their definite strong-points, but in the balance, we generally held an edge in allround ability. But unfortunately, we didn't always exploit the team's capabilities to the fullest, as evidenced by our indifferent performances in narrow losses to Lane Cove & Lindfield.

Like all seasons, 1989/90 had its share of ironies:-

- Narrow losses which should have been victories Lindfield, Lane Cove, and probably Epping.
- \* Tight victories that could easily have been defeats Roseville, Bexley.
- \* Leading the competition with 4 rounds to play, then having 2 consecutive matches washed out (receiving no points & slipping to 3rd).
- \* Then winning Semi-Final outright only to have both days of the Final washed our & winning the premiership.

#### "Indeed a year of anguish and joy"...

I think the most pertinent point about the season, was that as it progressed, the team developed in character & team spirit, with each player contributing to this development through their encouragement & support of each other. From a personal viewpoint it was a pleasure to captain such a co-operative collection of cricketers - for of whom I have grown an authentic fondness - (their attitudes made 1989/90 for me, THANKS FELLAS!).

The success of the team rested very firmly on the "assorted shoulders" of the well balanced bowling attack - which was instrumental in continually dismissing the opposition for very moderate totals. The efforts of the bowlers were supported on most occassions by "top drawer" team fielding performances. The Batting was a different proposition it could best be described as "brittle" (contrary to its appearance on paper), with some "Heart-Stopping" moments a feature, however by the business end of the season its true potential was beginning to emerge.

#### BOWLING

The "KEY" to our accomplishments - all the Pace Bowlers were consistent, economical & penetrating, particularly - George Kassis who's outswing proved lethal, Mike Easey who's left arm seamers provided the variety & change of angle need, & Vinnie Connor who's enthusiasm & control never let us down; for the first 2/3 of the season they left the spinners very few spoils. Tom Wood's legspin & to a lesser extent Brett Tribolet's offspin came much more into play later in the season.

#### FIELDING

The fielding was generally good and at times simply "First Class" (eg. v's Canterbury). In this most important department of the game all team members "had a go" with Demi Scavlos, Kevin Wick ourstanding, special mention should be made of Vin. Connor, Mike Wood & George Kassis for their commitment in this area. Tony Ross's Wicket - keeping & drive were inspirational to the team.

#### BATTING

The team's "Archillies Heal", generally, the batting was disappointing, the team collectively has much more ability than it displayed. Most batsmen had their moments, but much too often, these moments were in isolation - the notable exception being the \*\*\*A Grade 2nd, wicket record partnership of 181 v's Strathfield by Craig White (77) & George Kassis (115 no)\*\*\* However, in the last 2 games (incl. the Semi-Final), when the pressure was really on the batting rallied very well.

It was also bery pleasing to see two A Grade players the reciprients of two of the Club's major awards:-
