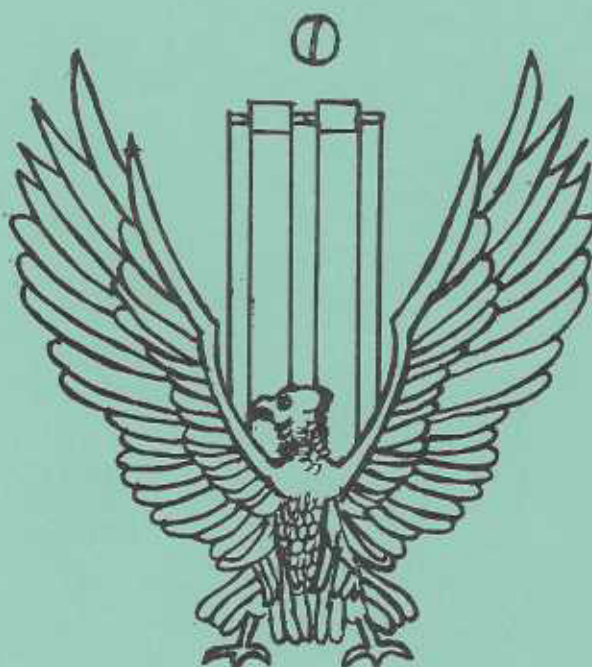

Gentlemen,

As a former "A" Grade captain I have had some pleasure in reporting performances in the Auburn Shire Cricket Club Annual Report.

This report gives no pleasure but is in effect an extremely sad one for this former player.

It is my sad duty to report the passing away of Lindsay Rees, a former stalwart of Auburn Shire C.C.

Lindsay had not been in the best of health since his heart attack a couple of years ago, but had made enough of an improvement to be able to play some more sport. Unfortunately, Lindsay passed away playing touch football on February 14, 1991.

The above statistics do not in any way tell the true story of Lindsay's worth in any cricket team he was selected in. They do not tell of the fighting spirit, the courage, the team man, the morale leader, or the chap who never questioned any decisions no matter how bad. Lindsay was a batsman in the mould of Doug Walters, great eye, little feet movement - but the ability to tear any attack apart. The best innings I have ever seen was his 94 in "A" Grade at Mona Park against Burwood, and I do not make that claim lightly.

His fielding was second to none as attested by his two fielding awards, and his high points scoring in every season he partook.

Lindsay was also a person who made himself available to serve on committees, although he had a young family, he never hedged his duty.

Lindsay was part of the 70's era, whereby the Auburn teams would return to Mona Park after every game for a post match drink (Pre R.B.T. days). Those were the times whereby we not only played cricket together but also Rugby League. Families dined out together and many end of season trips were made - Lindsay was an important and integral part of all of the above.

Lindsay loved his sport but more importantly his family. Dale his beautiful wife, Alison and Mitchell his proud children, were foremost in all of Lindsay's thoughts, words and deeds, even with his sporting mates his pride in his family was always evident.

I like all players who played with Lindsay are saddened at his death, but am proud to say that he was a team mate, and most of all a friend.

Thanks for the memory.....

PRESIDENTS REPORT

Season 1990-91 was another successful one for the club - not "successful" as far as winning a premiership but we again proved that Auburn is still one of the best run clubs in the competition as well as being one of the most consistant performers across all the grades.

The "A" Grade certainly had a mixed season - being the leaders after round 6 but losing the next four straight and then easily winning the last three games to finish equal third - this was unfortunately converted to 5th on averages. The batting of the team was the biggest disappointment with only two players scoring over 250 runs - there is so much talent in the batting as evidenced by some individual scores however, it is so inconsistent and undid the great work done by the bowlers. In the bowling department we excelled, with the highlight being the breaking of a 35 year old record by skipper Tom Wood - 69 wickets at 9.7 is a magnificent performance. I was fortunate enough to be around when George Parry took 66 wickets in 1956-57 and I thought that would never be bettered in "A" Shires, however, it goes to show that no record is safe with class players around. Tom was ably supported by the rest of the bowlers in particular Vinnie Connor and George Kassis, plus the fielding was generally of a high standard.

Our "B" Grade team was for the second successive year thwarted by the weather. Having reached the final the hard way and then being virtually washed out when playing with confidence and in a positive manner, really is a disappointment two years in a row. We will have to make sure next year by finishing on top prior to the semis. Congratulations to Joe Davino on taking the team to the final in his first year as captain. He moulded his players into a fine team which performed well under pressure. Mention should be made of Ken "Case" Collins (reaching the veteran stage) who has been the clubs most consistent batsman over the past two seasons, winning the batting average both years and in the season just gone scoring the most runs. Young players should learn from "Case's" concentration and attitude. Chris Master-son also showed with a great all round performance, it is a pity that his football commitments do not allow him a full season. The "B" Grade also produced some good young players such as Brett Hanshaw, Jason Cook and Matthew Benemann. These players will be pushing "A" Grade next season.

The most disappointing part of our season was the performance of the "C" Grade. This team promised so much at the start but could just not get going. The team suffered badly from unavailability and due to work commitments the team had a number of captains which does not contribute to stability of any side. Auburn has traditionally been strong in "C" Grade and we will be back as strong as ever as we all know we have the players to take out this competition again.

PRESIDENTS REPORT

Wally Shepherd's "D" Grade again made the semi finals - the fifth time in the last seven years. Being the last side selected this team naturally had a large turnover of players, 45 to be exact, yet we are always up the top of the "D" Grade competition. This confirms my earlier comment that the strength of the club is spread over all grades. In D's there were again some good individual performances with the highlight being the club's only century maker, Rod Palamino's 131no against Baulkham Hills and "Blomy's" effort of again being the leading run getter with 300+ runs which included the rare achievement of carrying his bat with 82no against Lane Cove to engineer a win with the tail end batsmen - a top effort.

It was also disappointing that our Under 24 team did not live up to their expectations. I think a more positive attitude is needed by some of the players in this team.

The club this season has experienced a first - unfortunately a first that we can do without. We discovered a DISHONEST TREASURER. Consequently it is not possible at this time to give an accurate financial statement. More detailed information will be advised prior to or at the A.G.M.

Mona Park again was in top condition and credit to Andy Donaldson and his staff for their efforts. We have been advised by council that approval has been given for the expenditure to build an awning in front of the number 1 dressing rooms - this hopefully will be up prior to next season.

Our social side was reasonably successful with post match Bar-B-Q's being generally well attended. Another successful day was had when we hosted the touring English side, Essex Eagles. We were fortunate to have in attendance four senior officials from Auburn Council, including the Mayor, who made a presentation to the tourists from the Auburn Municipality.

Finally our thanks to those who assist in keeping the club on its feet as always its the same group:-

Whilst I felt elation writing last seasons Premiership report, this time I felt a strong sense of "letdown", coupled with those frustrating thoughts of what might have been, with only a minimal amount of extra application in a couple of the close games.

However, although the season's final result was disappointing - it was not all doom and gloom because in many ways it was a successful season:-

- * By Finishing equal third with Macquarie Uni and Lindfield (Finalists) and only 2 points shy of Roseville (eventual Premiers)-we were eliminated from the final four only on averages. In this sense Auburn maintained its standing in the "UPPER ECHELON" of A Grade Shire Cricket teams.
- * In amassing 48 competition points the team bettered the points required to win the 1989-90 Premiership (42).
- * Won 8 out of 13 matches.
- * The team were a happy and enjoyable combination with no internal dramas.

The season "kicked off" in fine fashion with 5 wins in the first 6 games to Christmas (competition leaders at that point), but alas "THE TRAIN RAN OFF THE TRACK" and four successive losses were recorded (entirely as a result of indifferent batting). However, to their credit the team revealed good character to "RALLY STRONGLY" winning the last three matches to narrowly miss the semi finals (incidentally playing perhaps the best cricket of the season).

On reflection two particular incidents probably cost us a Semi Final place:-

1) THE WENTWORTHVILLE MATCH

Chasing a modest 157 to win - we were 30 runs behind with 5 wickets in hand (not out batsmen on 40 and 36 respectively). Wenty's "heads were down" when suddenly we collapsed and lost by 15 runs....CERTAINLY THE PROVERBIAL ONE THAT GOT AWAY.

2) THE CANTERBURY MATCH

Needing to win outright to have any chance at a final four spot, in reply to Auburn's 8/179 dec, Canterbury were 3/9 overnight.

The following Friday night it rained and due to a lack of communication and/or effort the covers were not placed on the wicket as planned. After losing 75 minutes play due to the wet pitch, we bowled Canterbury out for 39 in the first innings and when time ran out they were 7/84 in their 2nd dig.

The primary source of the teams success was the ability of the bowler, backed up by good fielding, to dismiss the opposition for moderate totals. Auburn's record in this facet of the game, could not be matched by any other "A" Grade team (Auburn took 173 wickets this season - the next best team only took 130 !!) In a very dry season highlighted by very heavy scoring in other "A" Grade matches, only ONE team scored in excess of 186 against us. The fielding which was generally of a high and committed standard was again a credit to the team, with Demi Sclavos' slip catching at times "breathtaking". Batting consistency was again like "tilting at Wind Hills" - "A QUEST IN VAIN".

BOWLING

Despite the setback of losing Michael Easey's services early in the season, the bowlers stuck to their guns and again "delivered the goods". Because the season was very hot and dry and the wickets flat - the pace bowlers had to work much harder for their wickets. George Kassis and Vince Connor performed very successfully by generally bowling a "tight line and length". Tom Wood took 69 wickets with his leg spin surpassing the previous "A" Grade record set by George Parry (66 wickets) in 1956-57. Bret Tribolet picked up some useful wickets despite restricted opportunities due to the success of the other bowlers.

FIELDING

The season's overall fielding performance was quite sound, although it slipped a bit during the very hot days experienced in early to mid January. But it was indeed one of the team's genuine strengths and usually provided the bowlers with great support. The great "determination and drive" of Demi Sclavos and Tony Ross was the "pace setter" in this key department of the game. Craig White, Vince Connor, Mike Wood, Bret Tribolet, Paul Barton all had their moments in the field during the season.

BATTING

Batting was the "SOFT UNDER-BELLY" of the team and it ultimately proved to be the team's downfall in the 1990-91 season. In a team that "on paper" appeared a very good batting lineup, only two players averaged over 20, nobody scored 300 runs, and the top individual score was 72. The real problem was that nobody wanted to put their head down and consistently "Graft" for runs. Everybody wanted to play shots and score quickly and consequently we "often collapsed quickly instead".

The inconsistent nature of the Mona Park wicket is a hinderance to the development of batsmen with the instincts for building "long solid innings". However, if wickets of quality like that used in the "A" grade game against Baulkham Hills (AFTER THE VISIT OF PETER LEROY), can be regularly produced maybe this problem will eventually be rectified and the young batsmen in the club will have a "TRUE SURFACE" upon which to develop their confidence and application.

In conclusion, as captain I would like to express my "heart-felt" thanks to the players for their support and co-operation during the season. Also my thanks to Norm Ross for both scoring and his friendship; to Frank Bignold for looking after us; and also offer my congratulations to the "B" and "D" Grades for making the semi final series.

"A" GRADE PLAYERS 1990-91 SEASON

CRAIG WHITE:

Craig as always was a pleasure to captain and was a very popular team member, and was quite outstanding in the field. However, as our opening batsman he had a mixed season, topping the batting aggregate (278 runs) and played some very valuable innings, but not really achieving the results a player of his ability should achieve. This was due to the combination of some poor umpiring decisions and the development of some faulty footwork. I would like to see Craig "stick at it" next season, because I still think he should be one of the "highest individual scorers" in the entire competition - that should be his personal goal. The highlight of Craig's season was dismissing former international Graham Beard.

PAUL BARTON:

Paul in his first season in "A" Grade played some very promising innings as an opening batsman (best score 65 vs Burwood) - he looked particularly good when driving, and with further experience and increased concentration early in his innings should score heavily in future seasons. One of the teams "personalities" he fielded soundly during the season and showed potential with his flighted off spin bowling. Paul's best years are very definitely in front of him and he should develop into a very good cricketer.

"A" GRADE PLAYERS 1990-91 SEASON

DEMI SCLAVOS:

Demi as usual had another "whole hearted" season whether it was batting or fielding. His fielding was again "inspirational" and some of his slips catching off the slow bowlers was "Bobby Simpson like". With the bat he played some valuable fighting innnings and won the batting average in "A's" with 22.45. He also scored two very good 50's with a top score of 64 not out. His catching ability enabled him to snare 16 catches. Demi is another player who has his best cricketing years ahead of him and is certainly "Captaincy Material". He was also one of the reasons why I enjoyed playing with Auburn.

BRET TRIBOLET:

Bret probably had a frustrating season; he undoubtedly would have liked to have bowled much more and bat higher, however, despite these personal frustrations he always maintained a "team first" attitude. He gave me his full support and often some valuable "clear thinking advice". His bowling opportunities were limited by the lack of runs scored by the team and later a little loss of confidence. Bret did produce some solid performances with the ball earlier in the season - (3/8 & 3/29 vs Strathfield & 4/37 vs Pennant Hills). He is now at the stage with his bowling that he needs to put in some "real" work, to sort out a few technical faults and regain his accuracy and penetration. Although he did not score heavily this season, Bret didn't surrender his wicket too often - being not out on 9 occasions. Thanks for your support and mature attitude this year, Bret.

VINCE CONNOR:

Vinnie had a great season, bowling with accuracy and penetration on many wickets that were unsympathetic to pace bowling. He was generally able to move the ball in the air and off the seam and placed pressure on the batsmen. Two of his outstanding bowling feats were 5/30 vs Wentworthville and a "stunning" 6/9 off 14 overs vs Canterbury.

In his specialist short leg position he collected 9 catches and made a number of sharp interceptions. Vinnie is a good example - if some of our batsmen possessed some of his competitiveness we would have won many more matches. Congratulations on an excellent season.

BRENDON TARLINTON:

Brendon experienced a season "with the bat" he would rather forget and put behind him - apart from his first innings effort against Lane Cove when he struck the ball very well. His main problem is a lack of self confidence, he does have the ability and range of shots to score runs in "A" Grade, however, he appears to go into his shell and not want to hit the ball hard - which is when he plays his best cricket. Brendon, relax and go for your shots. On a couple of occasions during the season when he "turned back the clock" and "donned the keepers gloves", he was great and pulled off some superb stumpings. Brendon is always an enjoyable team mate.

"A" GRADE PLAYERS 1990-91 SEASON

GEORGE KASSIS:

George is one of the most talented cricketers in the competition, however, he didn't make the impact on the 1990-91 season that was expected of him. Although he had to work much harder for his wickets on the dry pitches, his general "tight line and length" enabled him to have another good season with the ball... (29 wkts at 19.89). But it was his modest batting year that probably most affected the team's performance this season... (only two scores over thirty - 34 & 47). What would have happened if G. Kassis had a heavy run scoring year ??? The main problem with his batting was that he tried to attack too often and was not content to graft and wait for the right ball to hit. I am sure George would have learnt from this season and will make many bowlers pay heavily in the future.

TONY ROSS:

As Vice Captain, Tony offered plenty of valuable advice during the season, and was a competitive and driving force in the team. But he was another key batsman who was "off his game" this year (highest score 39), experiencing one of those frustrating seasons that all batsmen suffer sooner or later. Tony had another good season "behind the sticks" securing 12 stumpings and holding 16 catches to finish only 6 dismissals short of the "A" Grade record. He was just as disappointed as me that we missed the semi finals, but as a future "A" Grade captain he will have the opportunity to change that situation.

MICHAEL WOOD:

Mike had a moderate season "with the blade" for a player of his experience and ability. He commenced the season in good fashion with valuable match winning innings of 34 vs Strathfield and 30 vs Bexley. Form and confidence then deserted him until the last three games, when with a much more relaxed attitude he began to bat very fluently and effectively (eg, 46 vs Epping, 26 no vs Canterbury). Even though Scott was a reliable opening bat, he found his niche when coming into bat at number 3 or 4. His performance during the year included invaluable efforts such as his 64 against Lindfield.

Behind the stumps he was equally impressive particularly leg side deliveries. Scott definitely has the potential to be an "A" Grade keeper in the coming seasons.

When Scott made himself unavailable for the last three rounds of the season for other sporting commitments the gap left was very difficult to fill.

MATTHEW BENSEMANN:

His better performances were 61 against Pennant Hills, 61 against Epping and 80 against Baulkham Hills. These three innings helped him on his way to the club Batting Aggregate award this season.

A great team man, "Case" was never short on words of encouragement for the younger players of the team (myself included) whom I sure gained from his knowledge and experience.

Always gave 100% in the field. Congratulations again on a great season, Case.

JASON COOK:

A well liked member of the team, the high transfer fees paid to Baulkham Hills for his services certainly paid off !!

Jason played in all 15 matches in "B" Grade this season (the only person who did). It was also interesting to note that he took at least one wicket in every innings he bowled in with the exception of the reduced rain affected final.

So much so, when a change in field placing or bowling was considered warranted, that change was in place, resulting in victories which led the team to the FINAL, all as a consequence of the decisions made by Joe.

There were frustrating moments too, none more so than in the Final when rain intervened and basically robbed the B Grade of any opportunity for the premiership. How frustrating, the B Grade in consecutive seasons not being given the opportunity to win due to the weather - it was a "DEJA VU" for this past season's B Grade side.

The experience attained by Joe will stand him in good stead and I feel will add to his maturity as a leader, a cricketer and as a person.

The highlights of the season for Joe, apart from leading the B's to the final, were his remarkable achievement in snaring FOUR catches in an innings on two occasions, his 52 vs Macquarie Uni, 37 vs Strathfield and 32 not out vs Wenty in the final.

His decision to send Macquarie Uni in to bat in the semi was a gamble which had great dividends.

As a batsman, Joe needs to work on presenting a straight full face of the bat to the full pitched inswinging delivery instead of playing across the line. Off the back foot he has no problems. His fielding was of a consistently high standard and his leadership as referred to above was responsible for important wickets which the bowlers probably consider was their sole input in obtaining..... Only by being skipper will they ever really know.

Congratulations on your debut skipper season, Joe, and commiserations from all associated with the club when you were "weathered" out of the opportunity to make the season a more memorable one than it actually was.

Practice makes perfect and I think we must have 3 practice days a week to ensure that throughout the season players can have the chance to keep their eye in, bowlers their rhythm and so on. It is also another means of building harmony right through the club.

It is with pleasure that a report on the "D" Grade season 1990-91 is submitted.

On reflection, the season could be seen as a most enjoyable and successful one for the "D" Grade side. I feel sure that the team members enjoyed their season both individually and collectively. Individual performances were good to outstanding with most players meeting or exceeding their own standards. Some notably outstanding performances are recorded in varying other parts of this Annual Report.

Also recorded in this Annual Report is the teams match scores performances for each game throughout the season. Of the 13 competition matches played the side only lost 4 games. The match against Epping was a convincing loss, however, the other three games against Macquarie Uni, Bexley and Lindfield were lost by the smallest of margins....11, 13, and 8 runs respectively. With a little luck and more aptitude we should have won at least two of these matches....if we had won two of these games then we would have been playing our semi final from the Minor Premiers position instead of 4th and that in the end analysis would have made all the difference.

Team spirit was built up by a core of regular team members - and those other players who played irregularly were readily made to feel welcome and they generally fitted into the team.

A number of players who were intending to play with the team towards the end of the season (including the semi) found themselves unable to do so, and this did disrupt the teams overall preparation for the semi final series.

The side ultimately finished 4th in the competition and were so drawn to play the minor premiers, Warringah in the semi final. The venue was Weldon Oval, Warringah. As previously mentioned we could so have easily finished first or second on the competition table, however a lack of consistency put us back into 4th position.

The semi final side entered the match confident of a good showing against the Minor Premiers who we had beaten in Round 8 during the season. We knew that a win in the semi final would entitle us to favourites for the title.

In reviewing the semi final match an assessment of the two sides would show us to be very equal in team ability and balance. Looking at the final scoreline (Warringah 10/312 bt Auburn 10/145), I feel that this result was not a true indication of the difference between the two sides.

Auburn were asked to bat first on a wicket that had some early life in it. Early on the Warringah bowlers had the ball darting around off the wicket in both directions. Some moist areas on the wickets surface (why it was like this at the start I'll never know - it had not rained for more than a week leading up to the semi final) were the cause of a couple of early wickets. However, in the norm it must be said that most batsmen lost their wickets due to - a lack of application and more so a loss of patience.

Semi finals are played from 10am to 6pm. We had 110 overs to bat on the first day. Only to score 2 runs an over would have made us competitive. We tried to score too quickly and were bowled out for 145 in only 55 overs. Such a wasted opportunity...hopefully first time semi final players will learn from this experience.

Warringah on the other hand, applied themselves to semi final type cricket and ran out convincing winners. In contrast to our quick fire innings it took us 110 overs to bowl Warringah out....70 of those overs Warringah took to overall our 145, playing the hard grinding type of cricket that is required to win these long two day matches. A number of dropped chances in the first half of Warringah's innings allowed them to pass our score for the loss of some 5 wickets only. From the time Warringah got to about 175, the match was well over and they breazed through to 312 picking up their scoring rate to score at about 4 an over for the last 150 runs. We did not drop our bundle after they passed us, however, the intensity we had early (particulary when they were 1 for 0), certainly did fall away.

I must thank my vice captain, Steve Blomfield for his untiring assistance during the season, especially on the many occassions when last minute pull outs happened and replacements were required to put a full team on the field.

I'd like to thank all the other players who contributed to the running of the club and the organization of the four sides each week. Congratulations to the "B" Grade side on making the final for the second year running. Alas, the weather denied us again !!

Finally, congratulations and thanks to the "D" Grade players (all 45 of them) who made this season a most enjoyable one. I look forward to all the players again playing for our club in the upcoming 1991-92 season.

"D" GRADE PLAYERS 1990-91 SEASON

STEPHEN BLOMFIELD:

Steve had a few very good innings during the season, most notably his 82 not out against Lane Cove in round 6. This effort won the game for Auburn from a seemingly impossible position. Being 7/90 at tea chasing 165, Steve partnered with John Matta and put on an 8th wicket record of 62 with Steve going from 30 to 73 in this partnership. On top of all this the innings was played in very difficult (and wet) conditions. In the end the Lane Cove match was won, we batted on, we were bowled out and Steve who opened the innings was left carrying his bat unbeaten for the second time in his career. Other good innings came against Pennant Hills (50) and Roseville (42) which was highlighted by a Blomfield six over the trees onto Mona Street !!!! Was one of only three players to score over 300 runs in the season. Steve's attitude to batting is a lesson for us all. As I mentioned earlier, Steve's assistance was valuable and most appreciated by myself.

JASON BELL:

Jason is a excellent team player who contributes to whatever is necessary to help the team. Found his batting niche at number three later in the season and played some fine innings. Was promoted to "C" Grade mid season and even found himself in the B's for one match. When batting at number three found some self restraint and did not go after the ball with the same sort of gusto shown when batting lower in the order. This is an excellent quality that he has developed, he now has the ability to pick which ball to hit rather than try and hit them all. Should develop to a stage where he could score in excess of 300 runs a season. Catching was excellent - just ask Wentworthville. Definitely one of the better fielders in the club at this present time.

JASON MASKELL:

Jason was playing his first season with the club and showed great potential for a year 12 student. A very straight and hard hitter of the ball, he powered his way to a very good 68 against Wentworthville in a team score of 324. Jason seems to be just holding up an end and before you realise it he has racked up 20 or 30 runs. Being technically correct he has a very, very promising future as a batsman. His batting style is perfectly suited to turf cricket, he should score heaps of runs next season. Jason also opened the bowling on most occasions and showed his value in so doing. A bright future is ahead of Jason.

MARK PULLEN:

Mark played a handful of games during the course of the season. Showed to be a stylish batsman and wicket keeper who would score many runs with the benefit of more constant cricket. Hopefully Mark can string a few more games together in the next season.

GREG RYAN:

Greg came to the side late in the season and as such did not have many opportunities to show the form that saw Greg score some big runs in previous seasons. Greg is an accomplished opening batsman who scored a good 28 against Baulkham Hills. On this day he looked like regaining past form and going on to score a big fifty. Greg was also safe and reliable in the field and added some needed experience to balance the side in its efforts towards seasons end. Took an exceptional catch against Baulkham Hills, so exceptional that the Baulkham Hills batsman (who was captain) refused to believe that it could be possible to catch a ball so low to the ground. The catch was disputed hotly by the batsman who was sent packing by his own umpire. A truly sour incident that spoiled the elation of Greg's catch on the day. A good team player who would be greatly appreciated if he could play all season in the upcoming 1991-92 season.

MAZIAD KASSIS:

Maziad did not bat very well (or often) and saved his best effort for the semi final. However, his bowling was first class taking 21 wickets in "D" Grade at an average of 19.1. Operating as a stock bowler. Maziad was able to bowl long spells consistantly and was rewarded with wickets in just about every game he played. Unfortunately only managed to pick up 1 or 2 wickets each innings (unlike 1989-90 when he regularly took between 3 and 5 wickets per innings). Maziad experimented with the outswinger which did not always work and possibly contributed to his season tally only being in the 20's instead of the 30's. Bowled very well on a number of occassions, in particular the Canterbury game when he took his seasons best figures of 4/37.

CRAIG McMANUS:

Craig was having his first season with the club. After having been selected as wicket keeper for the Shires Green Shield side, he found his way to Auburn on the recommendation of the Shires Green shield committee. Started with the "D" Grade from round 7 becoming the teams wicket keeper for the rest of the season. Craig figured in 15 dismissals and clearly would have broken the "D" Grade record if he had played the full season. He also showed himself to be a solid middle order batsman, scoring a nearly match winning 50 against Lindfield. If Craig can keep up his wicket keeping and batting skills his future with Auburn is sure to be bright.

COLIN RYAN:

A very experienced and quality batsman who scored a couple of 50's in his six innings at the crease. A handy bowler and an excellant fielder rounded off a very good season for Colin. It was a shame that work commitments did not allow him to complete his season with the "D" Grade as I feel sure that his presence in the team for the semi final could have made alot of a difference.

ROBERT SHORT:

Another hard hitting middle order batsman who scored runs in both "C" and "D" Grades. His 66 not out helped us to win the game against Pennant Hills. Scored a total of 221 runs at 18.4 during the season. Filled in as wicket keeper early in the season with mixed success. His effort in not turning up on the second day of the semi final with no valid reason soured what could have been a reasonably successful debut season.

DAVID SUCHY:

David's bowling improved greatly as the season progressed to establish himself as the sides main wicket taker. An extra yard of pace and/or more lift off the wicket would open up further David's future as a top line bowler. During the season took 23 wickets at 16.17. He twice took a 5 wicket haul and his 5/37 off 21 overs against Macquarie Uni was his best bowling performance of the season. David also was a handy bat this year but did not get many chances to settle into a long innings. Batted well in the semi final top scoring with 28 not out.

JOHN MATTA:

John made an enthusiastic contribution to the teams early seasons matches. His bowling improved greatly from last year and was able to "bend" the ball in the air at times. Combined well with Steve Blomfield to guide the team to a win against Lane Cove from a seemingly impossible position. This game where he scored 20 odd showed that he can bat well when he takes his batting more seriously and has some confidence in himself.

BRAD STONE:

Another newcomer to the club, Brad proved to be a very handy off spin bowler and an enthusiastic all round cricketer. Has a good batting technique which with more practise should see him convert his seasons top scores of between 12-16 to a score of a much more. Bowled very well against Strathfield when he took 3/31. Next year should develop into a much stronger player.

TED SUCHY:

Business commitments and injury early in the season cut short Ted's season this time round. When able, Ted batted with the skill and experience that we are accustomed to and we hope of course to see him again in 1991-92. Ted seemed to hitting his straps with the bat when he scored a good 29 not out against Roseville in round 10....unfortunately that is when Ted's season came to an end. Bowled with accuracy and guile when the opportunity arose.

"D" GRADE PLAYERS 1990-91 SEASON

ROD PALAMINO:

Rod was playing his first season with the club being another one of the year 12 students from Benedicts at Auburn. He made a very definite impact whenever he played. An extremely gifted batsman he scored a magnificent 131 not out against Baulkam Hills. This innings was all class...he was 42 not out when the innings resumed on the second day. The team batted for only 20 overs until we had to declare. In this time Rod scored 89 runs in only 75 minutes batting time. In this innings he hit 7 huge sixes. If not for the fact that the team had to declare he could have easily scored a double century and shattered every club record for an individual that ever existed. In only 5 innings for the club he scored 262 runs at an average of 65.5. His lowest score was 28. With a bit more experience Rod could become an even better cricketer. Knowing the right ball to hit will come in this learning experience.

JAMAL AHMED:

Jamal is one of the few leg spin bowlers in the lower grades of Shires cricket. He is able to spin the ball but needs to increase his pace to force the opponents into errors. If he relies on batsman getting themselves out (eg, the Pennant Hills match where he took 5/70) then he probably will not have a lot of success too often. Jamal tried hard in the field and took a good reflex catch against Lane Cove. A lot of practice is still required in the field, as his overall catching is a bit shaky at present. Work on your bowling in the off season Jamal, and the results should be seen in future seasons.

My thanks are extended to the 45 players who participated in the "D" Grade side during the 1990-91 season. All players should feel proud that you have all contributed to a successful season for the Auburn "D" Grade in this season gone past. I hope you all can contribute in some way to the club in 1991-92.
