This is truly a magnificent achievement on the part of the players and their committee and shows what can be done with application, dedication and a stack of ability, also 3 turf wickets within the municipality to which they have access. Their 4th side was unlucky in that they had to play their 3rd in the semi and were eliminated.

Once again our application for a second turf wicket appears to have fallen on deaf ears. We always appear to get so close and then at the last minute the council seems to find some excuse why we can't have it.

It would appear that we do not know enough people in the right places. All we seem to achieve is to participate as the ball in a game of ping pong between the council and the sports committee. The council refers it to the sports committee, the sports committee back to the council, back to the sports committee and so on.

I am sure that the club will continue to prosper and overcome these difficulties because of its members and if it didn't it just wouldn't be cricket.

## "A" GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

With the exception of C grade, and a few individual high spots, 74-75 has been a somewhat disappointing season for Auburn Shires. In particular the A grade, although finishing in the top half of the competition, never realised its full potential and fell badly by the wayside in crucial matches, failures that cost us a semi-final berth.

As in previous years these vital losses can be directly attributable to lack-lustre batting displays. With few exceptions our mental approach towards consolidation of an innings lacked the drive and determination prevalent in a matchwinning combination. The youth, enthusiasm and experience is present but until the batsmen temper the urge to attack every ball, with patience and commonsense, the A grade and the Club generally will remain among the ranks of the also-rans.

Another contributing factor to the relatively poor showing was the unfortunate unavailability of too many key players such as Felix Molski, Ron Johnson, Brian Moore, John Berry and Ken Collins for vital periods during the season. The Club is sadly mistaken if it believes a premiership can be won while players of this calibre are not on the paddock every week.

On the brighter side, the bowling, fielding and team spirit was of a high standard and it is gratifying to know that we maintain the ability to dismiss teams like Lindfield and Wenty on good batting strips for relatively small totals. In fact only Roseville managed to top 200 against us which augurs well for the coming season.

I know John Ross would have liked to express his appreciation for the enthusiasm and effort shown by all those who played under him and would wish us well in our quest for the ultimate goal in 75-76. His loss is a severe blow to the Club's prospects, but one that should be offset by the younger up and coming talents now with the Club.

Finally, congratulations are in order to Epping A grade for their second successive premiership win.

## THE "A" GRADE PLAYERS

### JOHN ROSS (Captain)

This has been a frustrating season for John, both as skipper and from the personal performance angle. John's captaincy, although more than adequate, could not offset poor team batting and the loss of key players in crucial matches, resulting in the A's just missing the semi's.

Looking at John's own performances, it was not until the latter part of the season that his true form came to light to show us all that he still remains one of the few players in shires with the ability to take an attack apart. Most memorable were his 57 against Epping and scorching 35 against Wenty.

The Club wishes him well while overseas.

### MAX BOWEN

A budding talent in the shires, Max fully justified his promotion to the A grade opening spot with some fine batting displays including an impressive century against Roseville. Unfortunately, too often, Max's innings were cut short by his indiscriminate running between wickets, and it is hoped this fault is rectified prior to commencement of the new season.

Apart from this his dour concentration and will to succeed at the crease, he set an example to the more seasoned batsmen, one they would do well to follow.

With further experience on turf there is no doubt he has the potential skills to become one of the top rungetters in Shire cricket.

Congratulations Max, on a fine A grade debut.

### KEN COLLINS

When in form Ken can be a devastating rungetter as he proved early in the season, when after 5 rounds he was by far the highest scorer in A's. Unavailability and a run of outs followed resulting in only a mediocre seasonal aggregate of 223 at an average of 18.58. This is well below Ken's capabilities and the Club looks to a more consistent batting performance in 75-76.

Exceptionally reliable in the outfield.

### RAY GENTLES

Ray's tally of 271 at 20.85 was better than most but still well below expectations from a player of his calibre and experience. Nevertheless on a number of occasions it was gratifying to see Ray adjust his game to the situation at hand, the sign of batting maturity. Highlights were an attacking 66X against Roseville and patient 41X against Canterbury, whilst enthusiasm and anticipation in the field was always of a high standard.

### VIC ELLIOTT

This was Vic's first full season as the spearhead of the A grade attack and although burdened by the lack of a full time opening partner, performed creditably with 25 scalps at an average of 19.80.

On hard and relatively fast wickets Vic commands the respect of most Shire batsmen as was shown against Bexley with the astounding figures of 8-24.

On the slower, damp pitch however, his inexperience on turf takes its toll and as yet Vic has not mastered the finer points of maintaining impeccable length and direction in situations where pace off the wicket is an impossibility. There is no doubt he has the basic qualities to become a real bowling force in Shires, but if Vic has aspirations towards achieving this goal, practice and a little thought behind each ball will be a must.

### JOHN BERRY

One of the keenest cricketers in the Club and without doubt one of the most talented bowlers. John continues to impress with his good, tight bowling performances and only on rare occasions this year was he denied a wicket during a spell.

Always reliable when fielding in his proper position at gully.

### LINDSAY REES

Lindsay played relatively well early on and was possibly a little unlucky to lose his opening spot when relegated to B grade mid way through the season. His major achievements this year probably occurred in the boudoir and that, I



suppose, is as it should be. They say it usually takes a season or two to loosen the knot, cool the blood, and unscramble the brain from the ardours of wedded bliss in order to show some semblance of cricketing form. Auburn truly hopes this is not the case.

#### JUDE FINDLAY

Jude's form behind the pegs this year was adequate for A grade Shires but disappointing when one considers the brilliance he is capable of. Each and every one of us hopes to see this abundance of talent in action in the near future.

#### PHIL GANE

Another young Club member who has more talent than was shown on the field this year. Phil never really got going with either bat or ball and will have to concentrate more on producing the goods. A first class fieldsman with a bullet-like return.

#### RON JOHNSON

Playing with Auburn for the latter half of the season only, Ron once again, produced some fine spells of accurate swing bowling capturing 19 wickets and causing concern among most opposing batsmen. His batting however, was not up to its usual high standard with only 100 runs from 8 innings, but since Ron takes great pride in his batting ability one can be sure to see an improved showing in the coming year.

#### FELIX MOLSKI

Hampered by injury Felix played little cricket in the A's and his return to the No. 1 bowling position should see Auburn back on a winning note.

#### BRIAN MOORE

Another part-time cricketer, Brian was in superb form with the ball until his departure after only a few matches. Playing full season he should prove to be a valuable asset to the A grade attack.

## TED SUCHY

The 1974-75 season was another extremely successful one for Auburn's "Sir Ted". 'An invaluable and regular member of the "A" grade side, not missing a match, Ted can always be relied upon for the supreme effort - whether it be compiling runs, snapping up catches or in retrieving the ball from the boundary (a regular occurrence in 1974/75).

Ted's all round performances are an indication of his true value to the Club, highlighted by a solid 61 against Burwood. Ted compiled 326 runs at an average of 20.38 during the season, held 10 catches, won the fielding award and when given the opportunity for a "trundle" (he was Captain) took 4/23 against Lane Cove.

A more than capable Vice-Captain, Ted was called upon to lead the side on occasions and acquitted himself well. In addition he was one of the star "performers" on the "Northern Tour" by Auburn to Gloucester.

## A GRADE AVERAGES 1974-75

### BATTING

Figures of 7/32, 6/39, 5/26 and 5/25 speak for themselves and his final tally of 26 wickets at 7.38 not only set a new "C" grade record it also won him the Club trophy for the bowling average.

### ALAN SMEE

No doubt the best all-rounder in the "C" grade comp. - 253 runs at 18.0, 29 wickets at 13.89 and 14 catches. Alan's fielding alone would get him into any side, some of his catches were near impossible and he has a magnificent "arm". His accurate bowling earned him 29 wickets and during the 152 overs he bowled an average of only 2.4 runs were scored per over, this is very good for a "slowie". A great season Alan, and your efforts deservedly earned you the "George Parry Player of the Year" trophy - congratulations.

### PHIL PERKINS

Phil only played in 5 "C" grade games, yet scored 244 runs at 27.1 He is still one of the hardest batsmen to get out and played two particularly good knocks, 77 against Canterbury II and 65 against Epping I. Unfortunately the latter innings was not during the final when we could have done with a good start. However, Phil was an asset to the team with his experience and we hope he still keeps playing with the Club.

### MARTIN STOCKEN

One of the young players having his first turf experience, Martin showed a lot of ability and tremendous potential as a leg break bowler. He won promotion to the "B's" during the season and continued to take wickets to finish the season with 22 wickets at 10.2 - this was a great performance from a young inexperienced player with a big future. In the field Martin showed a lot of enthusiasm.

### PAT PERCY

Pat did not have a full season with the team and for the ability he has, he only had an ordinary year - only finishing with 169 runs at 16.9. He played a very good innings when needed against Epping II, scoring 63, but in all honesty Pat should be playing "A" grade with the ability he has. He showed what he can do with the ball when he was asked to open against Wentworthville, taking 4/27 off nine overs.

### NOEL JOHNSON

Noel missed the early rounds of the comp., but still managed

to take 20 "C" grade wickets at 10.7 off 95 overs - promoted to "B" grade he took a further 11 wickets in two games to finish the season with 31 at 10.3. He had the ability to get life out of a wicket when no one else could and most of his wickets were taken with sheer speed. Noel didn't have the opportunity to show his "batting" ability as every time he went to the crease, he ran out of partners.

#### PETER LAVERCOMBE

Another young player having his first full season on turf, Peter showed he also has a lot of ability and potential. He opened the batting on most occasions and showed some of our more experienced players what concentration and application means. His best innings, I feel, were his 32 and 30 against Lane Cove II, even though he was not out 51 in the 2nd dig against Pennant Hills. One small piece of advice Pete, give away that cut shot early in your innings, this led to your downfall most times. Peter fielded very well throughout the season and took some good catches.

#### PAUL STUTCHBURY

Paul only had 5 games with us, coming from the "B" grade to be the first "regular" keeper we had - even though Paul has only recently taken up the gloves he has, in my opinion, the potential to make "A" grade as a keeper - he had a tremendous match behind the stumps in the final, 4 catches and 2 stumpings. Paul was disappointing with the bat this year - he wants to "get on with it" too early in the innings and subsequently gets himself out. He is a better bat than his figures show.

#### MARK CLOUT

Also having his first year with the Club, Mark's figures also don't indicate his ability. Early in the season, due to the lack of early order batsmen, Mark was forced to bat higher than I would have liked him to, and he lost his wicket before he could settle down - this didn't help his confidence. However later in the season, he started to show what he could do, and one innings comes to mind, that against Lane Cove I when he was just getting on top of the bowling when he was bowled on a "shooter". Anyway you had a good first up season, Mark, and I look forward to seeing you have a better one next year.

### BOB LESTER

Bob was another batsman "forced" to bat high early in the season and he had one of those runs where nothing went right for him. However, he too came good, and his innings of 47 N.O. against Macquarie Uni. in 38 minutes was one of the best knocks of the season - he also batted very well in the final but had no support. But seriously, Don had a real good season finishing with 36 wickets and taking out the Club trophy for the bowling aggregate - well done Don.
