Background

Auburn District Cricket Club was founded in 1951and is based at Mona Park, Mona Street, Auburn.

The club is also known as the **Auburn Eagles**.

- Auburn DCC fields junior teams ranging in ages from U/10 to U/16.The junior teams play on synthetic wickets and have their home grounds close to Mona Park. The club also has its own Auburn Eagles Cricket Academy, as well as a Woolworth Blast program for boys and girls from 6 to 9 years of age.
- The club has an established Junior Pathway program, where juniors progress to play senior cricket for the club.
- Auburn DCC' senior teams all play on turf wickets, against teams from across the Sydney metropolitan area, with Grades 1-5 playing in the highly competitive Sydney Shires Competition. Whilst other senior teams play in limited over competitions
- Auburn DCC has produced some high-quality cricketers over the years, two notable ones being, Australian International fast bowler, Mitchell Starc and former Tasmania First Class all-rounder, Andrew Downton.
