PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is my pleasure to report on the Club's performance in our 33rd season.

Again we were unsuccessful as far as a premiership is concerned but all teams performed creditably and with a little more luck, could have picked up that elusive "flag".

The "A" Grade reached the semi-final only to go down to our local rivals Wentworthville, which was disappointing, as this season on paper the "A"s were the strongest team we had fielded for some time, however paper teams don't win competitions and even though there were many fine individual performances, they could not get their act together and most games were won by the bowlers. Only four players scored over 200 runs and two of these were opening bowlers, and as can be seen from the bowling analysis, the figures are outstanding. The fielding and catching was excellent, led by skipper John Ross who figured in 33 dismissals behing the stumps, just one short of his own Club record and Dane Harvey who took 23 catches in the field to break the "A" Grade record which has stood for 26 years.

The "B"s just missed out on the final four and were a little unfortunate with the weather and very close results (like losing by one run). However, they also put up a good effort, which included two centuries, two new batting partnership records and the Player of the Year in Paul MCDermid. This was a very young side and hopefully, a lot was learnt this year which should ensure success in the future.

Unfortunately the team that didn't go close was the "C" Grade, although they defeated some good teams, they could just not get going in a competition which has become very strong over the past few years. Again there were some good individual performances which also included two 'tons'.

The other unlucky team was the 'D' Grade who missed out on the four by the smallest percentage and the ease in which they won their last few matches indicated their all-round strength and there is no doubt in my mind that they would have won the competition if they had made the final four. Winning the Limited Over Competition was only a small consolation for a team which started the season slowly but became one of the best sides. Using 36 players during the season doesn't help any team, but analysing the figures, there were no "stars", just consistant performances where everyone contributed to the team's performance.

This season also saw the re-introduction of the North-South Harbour representative matches which culminated in a combined Shire Team playing against a NSWCA X1. Our Club was extremely well represented with Ken Farley, David Harvey and John Moloney in the senior South Side and Glen Clarke, Tony Ross and Darrin Hudson in the Under 21 Team with Mark Cotter as reserve player. In the match against the NSWCA, David Harvey, John Moloney, Ken Farley and Tony Ross won selection. This is another indication of our playing strength and congratulations to all players selected. It is intended to continue with these representative games in the future, to be held prior to Christmas - so let's get those performances on the board early.

The continuing problem of unavailability also had a big bearing on disrupting teams and affecting team performances - too often players were unavailable for reasons which I consider were unacceptable and the players concerned need to have a more responsible attitude to the Club and their teamates.

The financial position of the Club is reasonable, but we are experiencing many increased costs and members must be prepared for an increase in fees which I feel will have to occur this year.

We still have the perenial problem of lack of "workers" to look after the day to day matters and unfortunately the season just gone was one of the worst we have experienced for some time. We cannot run a Club and accomodate up to 60 players with 2 or 3 people doing everything - it is imperative that more, a lot more, people need to be involved in this area and have a more responsible attitude to the running of the Club. This also applies to those who accept positions on Committees, unless you are prepared to put a bit of time and effort in, it is no use accepting these positions. It was indeed a disappointing season in this regard.

A new trophy was introduced this season, that being for the Most Successful Slow Bowler - this trophy has been initiated and donated by Brian "Chica" Moore, one of the Club's all time great slowies (also one of the Club's all time great characters). This gesture is greatly appreciated by the Club and we extend our sincere thanks to "Chica".

Finally, congratulations to all players for representing the Club in the sporting manner for which we are renowned and thanks to those who did contribute to the administration of the Club. Also, special thanks to Eric Howard, Val and Norm Ross and Leo Farley for their support and assistance.

A special thanks to Ken Mosten, our Groundsman for his efforts -Ken worked hard under difficult conditions to prepare good wickets at Mona Park

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Well, still another season has gone by and still the drought between premierships continues. Although this season, one feels, really should have been our year, again. Consolation however, did come at the seasons end with the "D" Grade taking out the limited over competition (and would have been the premiers if a final four spot had been achieved).

The statistically outstanding feature of the season was the huge number of runs scored by batsmen. If our President was pleased in our "President's Report" last season in praising eleven batsmen topping 250 runs or better, then what does one say about this seasons total of sixteen players!

Truly, this shows how much depth there is in the Club's batting, (if only everyone of these sixteen could show form on the same day!). Of the sixteen players past 250 runs, five of them cleared 400 runs which is really a great effort

Congratulations to Mark Cotter on achieving the milestone of 500 runs plus in a season and also for taking out the batting aggregate. Mark's tally of 514 was the highest aggregate since 1976 and his average of 36.7 shows his overall consistency. Although the records do not clearly show it, I am positive in saying that Mark's feat of scoring two centuries this season is a first for the Club.

I was honoured enough to see two of Mark's better innings during the season. His only innings in "D" Grade yielded a century and his score of 74 in "C" Grade out of a total innings score of 140 was, to me, a gem, indeed it was a match saver.

The other outstanding batsman of the year was Tony Ross who, on the aggregate finished only 18 runs behind on an unlucky 496. Although Tony did not score a ton this season, she showed his consistency by scoring 50 or more on no less than four occasions. His score of 81 against Roseville at Mona Park must surely have been worth between 130-150 runs at any other Shire's ground, considering that this particular day the grass at Mona was at its longest and spongiest all year.

Congratulations to Ken and Andrew Farley, Darren Hudson, Glen Clarke and Greg Guthrie who were the scorers of centuries last season.

Changing the subject to bowling now, and isn't it strange how when a Club goes well with the bat, inevitably bowling suffers. On paper each of the four sides had a good bowling line up for each match, however, (with the exception of "A" Grade) could never seem to roll sides cheaply, consistently. We all know the "A" Grade saga, where although they made it a point of

dismissing the opposition cheaply quite regularly, could not put it together with the bat (as a team).

Of the leading wicket takers, John Maloney with 35 led the way, with Dave Harvey on 33 behind. The disturbing fact looking at the statistics this season was the fact that from the top nine bowlers this season, five of them were from the "A" Grade side. This left only four bowlers from the remaining three sides in the best of the bowlers for the 1983-84, the only conclusion to draw is that in the bowling department there was no consistent bowlers in "B" Grade down for the season. Definately, something to work on.

Congratulations to Paul McDermid from the "B" Grade on taking out the player of the year trophy. Paul showed his outstanding talents as an all round cricketer last season in leading his side in the wicket taking (in fact his 27 wickets was double the next best bowler who bagged only 14). He also scored 268 runs in "B's" with a top score of 86 not out, which was second in the batting for this grade. On top of the batting and bowling, he ran second in the Club's fielding award, truly a worthy winner for 1983-84.

While talking of the fielding award, the winner was our popular "A" Grade skipper John (Roscoe) Ross with a tally of 52 points. I'm sure nobody would doubt what a fine wicket keeper John is as well as being (and this came as a direct quote from the Roseville "A" Grade Captain to me) "the best Captain in the Shire Competition". Congratulations "Roscoe" on a fine season with the gloves. (P.S. John only needs 21 more catches to knock off the Club record from our Grandfather of cricket, D.T.).

It is with great pleasure that I have to inform all members that 1984-85 is going to be a historic year for the Shire's Competition. A restructure of the competition has made way for the Strathfield and Baulkham Hills Clubs to enter the A, B, C and D Grade competitions. This now leaves a 14 side competition in A and B Grade, with a 14 side C Grade competition - not however, 14 different Clubs and a 10 side D Grade competition. All players will receive further information at the A.G.M.

I, as Secretary, would like to congratulate Ken Mostyn our Groundsman on a fine effort again this season. Under lifficult circumstances he once again produced some top class cickets. Speaking for myself as a regular player on Mona Park

Number two, one must wonder whether there is a better "C" or "D" Grade wicket in the whole competition, well done Ken.

On a negative side now and it was extremely disappointing to see the number of people who have <u>failed</u> to pay fees up until May this year. It cannot be stressed more highly how important fees are to the running of the Club, for without the fees there probably would be no Club. The forthcoming season will see a much harsher policy taken on the collection of fees, I'm sure, so everyones co-operation next season will be expected.

I would like to express my utmost thanks to our President Dave for the help he has given me in my first year as Secretary. Dave was extremely helpful in reminding me about things that I tended to look over due to myself taking on both Shire's Records Officer and Club Secretary jobs this year. I could not speak too highly of Dave and would like to congratulate him on his efforts in maintaining the Club in this his 30th season with Auburn-Lidcombe. (I am positive he won't give the game away, after all, he only needs another 165 wickets to better George Parry, keep it up "Moses" you'll get there).

Also, thanks to all the other members on the executive for your help this year and I hope to see you all back ready and raring to go in 1984-85.

Best of luck for the coming season and I hope you all get to reach your goal for the season if you plan on having one and lets ensure Auburn-Lidcombe maintains its status as one of the top cricketing Shire Clubs in the Competition.
