#### ELEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

It is with great pleasure that we present this Eleventh Annual Report and Financial Statement for your consideration and adoption.

The Committee feels that this has been the most successful Season the Club has enjoyed since its inception. The "A" Grade side carried off the Premiership, the "B" Grade in finishing seventh occupied their highest ever position in the table, and in addition, we finished in third place in the Club Championship.

The average age of the players was much lower than in the past few Seasons and this was the reason for the all round improvement in fielding, a department, which no doubt, helped in the winning of the "A" Grade Competition.

Once again the Club was able to field ample players for every game from an original selection of only 28 and this speaks very highly of the keen attitude displayed. Our sympathy goes to those players who at times were not selected but still remained faithful to the Club in every way.

Both sides continued to play bright attacking cricket despite the fact, that in Mona Park, we have easily the largest and least conducive ground for high scoring in the Association. The wickets prepared were excellent and compared favourably with all other strips on which we played.

The Club should not be satisfied with the improved standard of this Season but should strive toward "scooping the pool" next Season. If we continue to show the same high standard of sportsmanship and approach to the game we are sure no one will begrudge the honours that come our way.

We look forward to the continued support both on and off the field of all Members.

Following a wonderful Season of cricket, space does not permit me to do justice to the number of individual performances of merit, which deserve praise.

The team spirit, and the approach of the players to each and every game was certainly the prime reason why the side was able to win the Premiership.

The semi-final and final provided a fitting climax as both games provided enough tension and thrills to satisfy any cricket lover.

Against Canterbury the position was grim after the first Saturday, and following a wonderful fielding and bowling recovery on the second day another batting collapse nearly saw the game slip from our grasp.

In the final against Burwood our batsmen laid the foundation of a victory which in the finish proved conclusive, although at one stage defeat was a possibility. Burwood's second innings of only 20 runs, after being 0-12, must be some sort of a record low for a final.

The ground fielding and throwing of the side was by far the best of any team in the Competition. Except for the odd bad day the catching was first class. Against University in the last Competition game, and again in the second innings of the final, the catching was nothing short of amazing, the like of which certainly could not be bettered.

The batting averages are certainly not flattering but it is difficult to compare scores with those of other sides when Mona Park is used as a home ground. The wickets were perfect, but the huge, slow ground makes a score of 150 really hard to beat.

Only four bowlers were used to any extent and their averages of between 8 and 12 per wicket are quite remarkable. The great fielding displays certainly helped the bowlers who dismissed the opposition sides for an average of only 112 runs per innings for the full Season.

In conclusion I wish to thank the players for their wholehearted support throughout the Season. Your efforts made my job relatively simple.

### THE INDIVIDUAL EFFORTS OF THE "A" GRADE PLAYERS ARE RECOGNISED AS FOLLOWS:

- JOHN SKINNER (Vice Captain): An excellent medium fast bowler whose 6 for 5 in the final against Burwood must be some sort of a record. Excellent fieldsman and a better batsman than his average shows. A wonderful help both on and off the field.
- KEITH GRIFFITHS: His batting provided the backbone of the innings on a number of occasions and his 52 on a bad wicket in the semi-final was a great effort. His wicket keeping was also of a high standard and he led the field for the number of catches taken.
- TREVOR BRISCOE: A dashing opening batsman and easily the best cover fieldsman in the Competition. His 71 against Lindfield sayed the side from complete collapse.
- JACK LAWTON: Played in every game and held up the new ball attack on a number of occasions. As keen as mustard and there is no better Club man playing the game.
- JOHN BRISCOE: A brisk young batsman who never quite got going. Is certain to improve. Extra good fieldsman.
- RAY HALL: Very versatile all rounder. Performances show his worth to the side both as a batsman and bowler. A real specialist in the slip field.
- BILL BALFOUR: Another wonderful all rounder. Continues to turn in terrific performances every Season. Also a great slip fieldsman.
- TERRY POWTER: Hard hitting batsman who did not strike true form during the Season. Took 8 catches in his limited appearances with the side.
- BOB WICKS: Most improved young player. Figured in a number of good stands late in the innings. His fielding and returns are excellent.
- KEN WRIGHT: Likes to gc for the runs. Joined the side late in the Season and proved a real acquisition.
- JOHN SCORGIE: Talented slow bowler who did not get sufficient opportunity to improve in the "A" Grade side. A capable batsman.

- P. PERKINS Vice Captain: Although Phil did not have the best of Seasons with the bat, his 2nd innings against Epping was what is usually expected from him and worth seeing. In all other departments Phil was of great assistance to myself and the team.
