TOM HAGGETT

The Auburn Shire Cricket Club was deprived of part of history of the Club when popular patron Tom Haggett passed away in May, 1980.

A great many of the more recent players and officials of the Club would hardly be aware of the amazing contribution Tom gave to the Club since its inception in season 1951-52. Tom never played for the Club, but has been involved in different capacities since the first meeting in a room at the rear of the Bank of New South Wales premises in Auburn Road in 1950.

His thirty years of service in administrative capacities cannot be chronicled in the same fashion as runs, wickets and catches but nevertheless was equally as important to a Club whose achievements he proudly admired and materially encouraged over that long period.

For the first two years of the Club's existance Tom was content to be a member of the newly born club and worked in the background to ensure the ground work laid the foundations for future success.

In 1953 Tom Haggett accepted the office of President a post he maintained actively for a record term of seventeen years. Tom was not a 'paper' President. On appointment he decided that the monthly meetings should be held at his private home. Any Club member who enjoyed a position on the committees during the next seventeen years will remember those meetings at Braemar Avenue, Auburn, where hours upon hours were spent in discussing the activities of the Club. Tom's charming, patient and understanding wife Enid provided endless suppers for every meeting and her contribution to the Club during that period can never be underrated in its overall development.

After seventeen years I shall never forget Tom asking me to accept his office as President and offering me all the assistance possible to carry out the duties he had performed so magnificently and for so long.

Tom took up the position of Senior Vice President for two years before accepting the post of Patron in 1973, the office he held until his death.

No tribute to Tom would be complete without recording his achievements in the many areas of his community activities and in partiuclar his contribution to sport throughout his entire life.

My first memories of Tom stretch back to watching him play soccer as left wing for North Auburn Methodist Church usually as a curtain raiser to the main game at Lidcombe Oval prior to the war.

Following service in the Army he returned to play cricket in the Auburn Lidcombe Association for Auburn Districts and later with Auburn Centrals. His left arm 'slowies' gained him bagfuls of wickets in each year as he 'fiddled' all the talented batsmen of the time into indiscretions.

Tom formed an association with the Silverwater Speedboat Club and held the position of Commodore for many years.

For one term of three years Tom was an Alderman with Auburn Council, a position in which he maintained his dignity in a political atmosphere so foreign to his thoughts, aspirations and ideals.

For many years Tom was associated in a number of offices with the Auburn Soccer club and his kind words were

invaluable to many players in a scene often highlighted by the semi professional attitude developing at the time.

One cannot underestimate the value to sport in the Auburn district Tom sponsored as a delegate to the Auburn Combined Sports Committee over the many years he was delegate. His wise council, his refusal to have any game denigrated by status seekers, and his level headed approach to problems are testimonials to his love of sport and what sport is all about.

Tom Haggett was a gentle, genial warm man who sought to ensure that as many young people as possible enjoyed the pleasure and privilege of playing the sports that he had loved over many years.

His unbroken contribution to Auburn Shire Cricket Club throughout its whole existence specifically and to sport and community activities in Auburn generally will not go unrecognised by those who knew and admired him for nearly fifty years.

In addition, the support of his wife Enid and their family was a significant factor in allowing us all to enjoy the benefit of Tom Haggett's immense contribution to a Club whose fortunes and favours he followed with undiminished enthusiasm for twenty years.

The Auburn Shire Cricket Club is much richer for his untiring efforts over the entire history of the Club.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Gentlemen,

I suppose the 1979-80 season could be described as frustrating particularly for the "A" Grade team. Allowing for the loss of four very good players from the previous season's team, namely David Stanford, Ted Suchy, Bernie Clifton and Brian Moore we still fielded an exceptionally strong and well balanced side, however as in past years when the important matches come around we seem to fall in a heap and do not perform to the ability the team possesses. In my mind there is no doubt we have the best bowling attack in the "A" Grade competition and the team bats to number eleven, however the matches lost this year were due to the lack of determination and application by our batsmen. was particularly evident in the semi-final when after a good start wickets were thrown away with the innings total being approximately 100 less than what it should have been. I think we all realise that more dedication is required for us to take our the "A" Grade comp.

The "B" Grade slipped a bit this year compared to last season. We started well but slumped in the middle of the season to miss the semis by 4 points. Again it was our batting in crucial matches that let us down as in only two matches did the opposition score over 200 runs against us. We did have the consolation of winning the new limited over competition for those teams not in the semis, and this was a good team effort and a satisfying end to the season.

The highlights of the season were some find individual performances, none better than the magnificent effort of Ian Johnson in taking 51 "A" Grade wickets at an average of 12.3 - Ian should have had a lot more wickets as quite a number of chances were missed. Ian is an example of the attitude and 100%

dedication that is required for success and he is without doubt the best bowler in Shires and this is the opinion of opposition Clubs. Other top performances were put in by our four "A" Grade teenagers - Darryl Wright and Tony Ross having a tremendous year with the bat with Brett Tribolet and David Harvey doing a top job with the ball - considering Darryl, Tony and Brett were having their first go at "A" Shires the performances of these young players is indeed encouraging for the future.

It is most pleasing to report that we will have our second turf wicket ready for the coming season which of course will enable us to have our "C" Grade back in the competition. With the aquisition of this additional wicket we must look to having two "C" Grade teams in the very near future to achieve the desired strength of our Club. Our thanks to the officials of Auburn Council who were responsible for us obtaining this additional wicket.

As most Club members realise, certain changes were made to the M. & S. competition last year - this was achieved by the formation of a committee representing all M. & S. Clubs, such committee meeting regularly with the N.S.W.C.A. to discuss and suggest points to improve the competition and its format. The meetings between the M. & S. committee and the N.S.W.C.A. have been most successful and we hope these meetings will continue for the improvement of cricket generally.

Our congratulations go to the Epping District Cricket Club for their outstanding success this season - winning all grades plus the Club Championship is a tremendous achievement.
