thanks to their Members and Officers.

The wicket at Mona Park is fast deteriorating and will need expert care if it is to be brought back to its former high standard. We would like it to be clearly understood that the groundsman is in no way to blame for this condition, but think excessive use and weather are to blame. Rube has done his best to make a job of things and to him the Club is grateful.

The Management Committee Meetings were well attended and we take this opportunity of thanking our President, Tom Haggett, and Mrs. Haggett and also Jack Woolley and Mrs. Woolley, for their

loyal co-operation in making these meetings a success.

The Club is also indebted to the local Press, especially Messrs. Bolstridge, Stratton and Jim Pratt, who have given a fair amount of publicity to our activities. Also local businessmen for their support and to Allan Barnes of N.S.W.C.A. for continued assistance and advice.

CAPTAIN'S REPORT - "A" GRADE.

Once again the "A" Team had a most successful Season, being the Minor Premiers at the conclusion of the Competition proper, only to be heavily defeated by Ryde in the Semi-Final. To Ryde I extend heartiest congratulations on their fine win against Burwood in the Final.

Twelve rounds were played prior to the Semi-Finals, with the following results:

Our batting was very inconsistent and too much responsibility was thrown on George Parry, who scored 620 runs at an average of 38.75. This player was a tower of strength and was assisted at times by some good performances from Bill Balfour (350 runs), Alan Ingleby (251 runs) and Ron Knott (229 runs).

George Parry completed an excellent double when he collected 66 wickets (average 10.38) and bowled nearly 230 overs. Bill Balfour was called upon during the latter half of the Season and was immediately successful, taking 25 of his 31 wickets during the last five matches. John Skinner and Bill Ansell also bowled well at times.

One sad note was the death of "Mo" Parry towards the end of the Season. This grand player and sportsman had again taken 30 wickets in his few appearances during the Season before illness took its toll. To his widow, Mother, and especially to George, I extend my deep and heartfelt sympathy.

The Team's fielding at most times was sound at at times, excellent. Players to shine in this most important department were Alan Ingleby, Bill Balfour, John Skinner, George Parry and Hilton Harrison. The wicket-keeping was in the capable hands of Athol Mines, who claimed 14 victims and once again proved his worth to the Club in this most important position.

A big disappointment to me was the very bad wickets at Mona Park and the adverse criticism of the visiting teams. This is no reflection on the groundsman, Rube Finch, who tried hard with the meagre means at his disposal.

I would like to thank the Team for their continued support and co-operation which made my job much easier and I deem it a great privilege to have been skipper to such a fine bunch of chaps.

In conclusion, I would also like to thank Mr. Jack Whitford for his untiring work as Secretary, and Mr. Tom Haggett, our President, for his help and interest to the Club.
