PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Gentlemen,

I am pleased to present this the Nineteenth Annual Report of the Auburn Shire Cricket Club.

The 1969—70 season was one of mixed fortunes with all sides recording some very good wins but losing other games which they could well have been expected to win For instance, the "A" Grade, while finishing near the bottom of the ladder, achieved a notable victory over the ultimate premiers, Wentworthville, in the last round of the competition.

The overall performances of the "A" Grade side appeared to suffer from a lack of depth in bowling and through lapses of concentration in the field resulting in many vital catches being dropped. Many of the more experienced members of the side, while still as keen as ever, did not play at the top of their form. On the other hand, new players, Leon Webster and John Ross, proved the most consistent players in the team. It was pleasing to see one of our young players in Ray Gentles start the season in "C" Grade and finish up in "A" Grade.

The "B" Grade played consistently and, with a little luck, could have again finished in the four. The senior members of the side showed their usual good form and enthusiasm and were ably supported by the younger chaps, many of whom were having their first season with the Club.

The "C" Grade had its most successful season for some time and fulfilled its role of blooding the new players. Among these players were Gary James, Gary Black, David Viegel and the Klein brothers, John and Peter. Most of these players obtained valuable experience in the higher grades as the season progressed. Gary Black, a young wicketkeeping prospect, played the last game of the season in "A" Grade and impressed the senior members of the side with his potential.

During the season, the Club lost two of its most promising players in Lyle Fry and David Stanford, both of whom were called up to play for Western Suburbs Club. While we were disappointed in losing these boys in somewhat unfortunate circumstances, I am sure all members wish them well in their cricketing future.

As usual, I would like to thank the Auburn Council, the Combined Sports Committee and the Mona Park groundsman for their co-operation. The new sightscreens have been erected but require modifications before they will be of maximum benefit. It is hoped that the necessary work can be done before the start of next season.

I would also like to thank the members of the Club's Management Committee without whose efforts the Club could not operate.

Once again, I wish the Club success in the forth coming season and I am sure that, if all players apply themselves to the fullest of their ability, we can confidently look forward to improved results.

Once again I have the opportunity of submitting the "B" Grade report for the 1969—70 season, but first, congratulations to the Shire Premiers, Wentworthville in "A" Grade, Lane Cove in "B" Grade and Lane Cove and Canterbury as joint Premiers in the "C" 's.

By looking at the final points score it might appear this season was unsuccessful, however, we finished only 6 points from 4th place and with the number of close matches we could have finished much higher. But the most important point to mention is the performances of the number of new young players in the team having their first season on turf. Players such as Gary James, David Veigel and Gary Black all performed very well, and all have the natural ability to become top cricketers.

As was the case last season, the lack of penetration in our bowling, cost us a number of wins, as the batting in general was good, although at times inconsistent, and the fielding and catching was, to say the least, first class.

Finally, my thanks to the whole team for their support and enthusiastic approach to every game and also for the manner in which all games were played. Also a special personal thanks to Eric Howard for his tremendous assistance off the field, which made my job much easier.

DAVE TRIBOLET

THE "B" GRADE PLAYERS

PAT PERCEY (V.Capt) Once again Pat had another good season, and won the batting average — his promotion to "A" Grade for the latter part of the season was well and truly justified —Pat was most unfortunate to miss out on his second "ton" for the B's when he ran out of partners with a great 94 n.o. against Canterbury.

JOHN ROSS John came to us this year from the Epping Club and certainly showed what an acquisition he was, not only with the "gloves" but as a hard hitting opening batsman. Another player who quickly forced his way into the A's, John finished the season with 30 dismissals and 456 runs — a very good performance.

WALLY SHEPHERD Wally did not get going with the bat until late in the season and consequently did not score as many runs as we expect of him. However he still finished with 326 runs at an average of 23.7, and filled in very well with the new ball on a number of occasions.

LEON WEBSTER Another player having his first season with the Club, Leon showed what a good all-rounder he is. After scoring 150 runs in 5 innings and taking 14 wickets at an average of 9.6, Leon was promoted to the A's and continued to perform well. He won the Player of the Year award, which was an excellent effort considering he only played in 10 of the 15 rounds — a great performance.

GARY JAMES Gary came to us this year from the local Church Club and his performances in "C" Grade soon won him promotion to the B's, and eventually to the "A" Grade. A young player of tremendous ability, Gary finished the season with 268 runs in all grades at an average of 16.7 and took 30 wickets at 12.2 each. An excellent fieldsman, and was runner up in the Player of the Year award — an excellent perform—ance from a talented cricketer.

KEITH GRIFFITHS Keith came to us from the A's and although his batting was not as good as in past years he still finished with a fair average — his 71 runs against Canterbury was a good knock. Kept wickets well and made some great stumpings including 3 in one innings.
